# For your safety

### **KEEP YOUR DEVICE DRY**

Your device is not water-resistant. Keep it dry.



#### **GLASS PARTS**

The device screen is made of glass. This glass can break if the device is dropped on a hard surface or receives a substantial impact. If the glass breaks, do not touch the glass parts of the device or attempt to remove the broken glass from the device. Stop using the device until the glass is replaced by qualified service personnel.



#### PROTECT YOUR HEARING


To prevent possible hearing damage, do not listen at high volume levels for long periods. Exercise caution when holding your device near your ear while the speakerphone is in use.



# Insert the SIM and memory card


Read on to learn how to insert a SIM card into your phone.

- Important: Your device uses a micro-SIM card, also known as a mini-UICC SIM card. Use only original micro-SIM cards. Use of incompatible SIM cards, or use of SIM card adapters, may damage the card or the device, and may corrupt data stored on the card.
- Note: Turn the device off and disconnect the charger and any other device before removing any covers. Avoid touching electronic components while changing any covers. Always store and use the device with any covers attached.
- **1.** Switch your phone off.
- **2.** With the back of the phone facing you, put your finger in the seam between the screen frame and the bottom corner of the back cover. Bend the cover open, and remove it.



Do not use any tools, as they may damage the phone.

**3.** If the battery is in, lift it out.



4. Slide the micro-SIM card into the SIM slot with the metal contact area down.



**5.** If you have a memory card, push the card into the memory card slot. It is recommended that you use a fast microSD card from a well-known manufacturer.



**6.** Line up the battery contacts, and put the battery in.



**7.** Press the bottom edge of the back cover against the bottom edge of your phone, and snap the cover into place.




8. Switch your phone on.

# Remove the SIM and memory card

Got a new SIM or memory card? Learn how to remove the previous card from your phone.

- **1.** Switch your phone off.
- **2.** With the back of the phone facing you, put your finger in the seam between the screen frame and the bottom corner of the back cover. Bend the cover open, and remove it.



3. If the battery is in, lift it out.




**4.** To remove the SIM card, pull it out from the slot.



**5.** To remove the memory card, pull it out from the slot.



**6.** Line up the battery contacts, and put the battery in.



**7.** Press the bottom edge of the back cover against the bottom edge of your phone, and snap the cover into place. Don't press the keys while attaching the cover.




# Switch the phone on

Switch your phone on, and start exploring it. Press the power key until the phone vibrates.



# Switch the phone off

Press and hold the power key, and drag the lock screen down.



# Lock the keys and screen


If you want to avoid accidentally making a call when your phone is in your pocket or bag, you can set your keys and screen to lock automatically.

Press the power key.



# Unlock the keys and screen

Press the power key, and drag the lock screen up.



### Set the keys and screen to lock automatically

On the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, tap **ALL SETTINGS** > **lock screen** > **Screen times out after**, and select the length of time after which the keys and screen are locked automatically.

# Charge your phone

Learn how to charge your phone.

### Charge your phone with a USB charger

Your battery has been partially charged at the factory, but you may need to recharge it before you can switch the phone on for the first time.

Make sure you use a compatible USB charger to charge your phone. The charger may be sold separately.

- **1.** Plug the charger into a wall outlet. If necessary, connect the USB cable to the charger.
- **2.** Connect the micro-USB end of the charger's cable to your phone.



3. When the battery is full, disconnect the charger from the phone, then from the wall outlet.



You don't need to charge the battery for a specific length of time, and you can use the phone while it's charging.

If the battery is completely discharged, it may take up to 20 minutes before the charging indicator is displayed.

**Tip:** You can use USB charging when a wall outlet is not available. Data can be transferred while charging the device. The efficiency of USB charging power varies significantly, and it may take a long time for charging to start and the device to start functioning.

Make sure your computer is switched on.

First connect the USB cable to the computer, then to your phone. When the battery is full, first disconnect the USB cable from your phone, then from the computer.

The battery can be charged and discharged hundreds of times, but it will eventually wear out. When the talk and standby times are noticeably shorter than normal, replace the battery.

### Connect the headset

Enjoy your favorite music, or free your hands for other things when in a call.

The headset may be sold separately.

Connect the headset to your phone.




Do not connect to products that create an output signal, as this may damage the device. Do not connect any voltage source to the audio connector. If you connect an external device or headset, other than those approved for use with this device, to the audio connector, pay special attention to volume levels.

### **Antenna locations**

Learn where the antennas are located on your phone to get the best possible performance.

Avoid touching the antenna area while the antenna is in use. Contact with antennas affects the communication quality and may reduce battery life due to higher power level during operation.

The antenna areas are highlighted.



# Your first Lumia?

Let's get started. Set up your new phone, explore your phone's views and menus, and learn how to use the touch screen.

# Set up your phone

Make the most out of your phone's features from the get-go.



When you turn your phone on for the first time, your phone guides you to set up your network connections, phone settings, and Microsoft account in one sitting.

You need a Microsoft account to back up and restore your phone, to buy, install, and update apps, and to access some Microsoft services, such as:

- OneDrive
- Hotmail
  - Outlook

You can use the same username and password on your computer and phone.

- 1. Turn your phone on, and follow the instructions shown on your phone.
- **2.** When asked, create a Microsoft account. If you already have an account for Microsoft services, such as Xbox Live.com, Hotmail.com, or Outlook.com, or you have created a Microsoft account on your Surface tablet or Windows PC, sign in with that username.

Make sure you remember the credentials for the Microsoft account you added to your phone. You need them if you want to change the device protection settings or reset your phone.



**Tip:** You can also create a Microsoft account later. On the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, and tap **ALL SETTINGS** > **email+accounts** > **add an account** > **Microsoft account**.

Parents must approve the account for children under the age of 13. To approve the account, on the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, tap **ALL SETTINGS** > **email** +**accounts** > **Microsoft account**, and follow the instructions shown on the phone.

You can also create or manage your account at www.live.com.

- **3.** Fill in your account details.
- **4.** Type in your phone number or an alternative email address. They are used to send you a one-time verification code and to protect your data.
- 5. Select how you want to get your one-time verification code.
- **6.** When asked, type in the last 4 digits of your phone number or your email address.
- 7. When you receive the code, type it in, and you are ready to back up your data and use your phone.
- **Tip:** If your screen turns off, press the power key, and drag the lock screen up.


# Explore your tiles, apps, and settings

Everything you need is on 2 views: the start screen and apps menu. Fill the start screen with shortcuts to your favorite apps and the contacts you need the most, and find all your apps easily in the apps menu.

The start screen consists of tiles, which are shortcuts to your apps, contacts, browser bookmarks, and more. Some tiles may show you notifications and updates, such as your missed calls, received messages, and the latest news.




1. To see all the apps on your phone, on the start screen, simply swipe left. To return to the start screen, swipe right.




Tip: To go back to the start screen from any view, tap the start key 🚛

The apps menu is the home to all your apps – in neat alphabetical order. All the installed apps end up here. To look up an app in the apps menu, tap ②, or tap a letter.



2. To add an app shortcut to your start screen, in the apps menu, tap and hold the app, and tap **pin to start**.

**Check notifications and change settings quickly** Swipe down from the top of the screen.




In the action center, you can quickly see notifications, such as your missed calls and unread mails and messages, open the camera, and access all phone settings.

# Navigate inside an app

There's more to your apps than meets the eye. To find more views in an app, swipe left. To discover more actions, use the options menu.


In most apps, to go to another view, swipe left.



# Find more options in an app

Tap •••.

In the options menu, you can find additional settings and actions that are not shown as icons.



### Use the touch screen

Explore your phone with a tap, swipe, or drag.

Important: Avoid scratching the touch screen. Never use an actual pen, pencil, or other sharp object on the touch screen.

To open an app or other item, tap the app or item.

# Tap and hold to open further options

Place your finger on an item until the menu opens.



### Tap and hold to drag an item

Place your finger on the item for a couple of seconds, and slide your finger across the screen.



#### Swipe

Place your finger on the screen, and slide your finger in the direction you want.

For example, swipe left or right between the start screen and the apps menu, or between different views in the hubs.




### Scroll through a long list or menu

Slide your finger quickly in a flicking motion up or down the screen, and lift your finger. To stop the scrolling, tap the screen.



#### Zoom in or out

Place 2 fingers on an item, such as a map, photo, or web page, and slide your fingers apart or together.



### Lock the screen orientation

The screen rotates automatically when you turn the phone 90 degrees. To lock the screen in its current orientation, on the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, and tap **ALL SETTINGS** > **screen rotation**. Switch **Rotation lock** to **On** 

Screen rotation may not work in all apps or views.

# Back, start, and search keys

The back, start, and search keys help you navigate your phone.



- To see which apps you have open, tap and hold the back key —. You can then switch to another app or close the ones you don't need.
- To go back to the previous screen you were in, tap the back key —. Your phone remembers
  all the apps and websites you've visited since the last time your screen was locked.
- To go to the start screen, tap the start key . The app you were in stays open in the background.
- To search the web or for items on your phone, tap the search key \( \mathcal{O} \).
- To control your phone with your voice, tap and hold the search key \( \mathcal{O} \), and say a voice command.
  - This feature is not available in all languages. For information on the supported languages, go to **www.windowsphone.com**.
- If your phone has Cortana, to control your phone with your voice, tap and hold the search key \(\mathcal{O}\), and say what you want to do. Or, to change the Cortana settings or use other Cortana functions, tap the search key \(\mathcal{O}\).
  - Cortana is not available in all regions and languages. For information on the supported languages, go to **www.windowsphone.com**.
- To switch the vibration of these keys on or off, on the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, tap ALL SETTINGS > touch, and change the setting for navigation bar. Changing the vibration setting for incoming calls doesn't affect the vibration of the keys.

# **Transfer content to your Lumia phone**

Learn how to transfer content to your Lumia phone.

# Transfer content to your new Lumia phone

There are nifty ways to transfer your photos, videos, and other important stuff from your old to your new phone.

These instructions may not apply to all phone models and manufacturers.

You may need to install some apps on your phone or computer for the transfer. Depending on what you need to install and how much content you are transferring, the transfer may take a while.

Some file formats may not be transferred. Some third-party converter apps may be available to convert the files to a format that can be transferred.

### **Copy contacts**

Have your nearest and dearest instantly at your fingertips. Use the Transfer my Data app to easily copy your contacts, text messages, and pictures from your old phone. The app does not work with all phone models.



**Tip:** If your old phone is a Windows Phone device, or if you have previously backed up your contacts to your Microsoft account, to import your contacts from the service, just sign in to your account on your phone. The contacts are imported automatically.

Your old phone needs to support Bluetooth. The contacts on your old phone need to be stored in the phone memory, not on the SIM.

- 1. On your old phone, switch Bluetooth on, and make sure the phone is visible to other devices.
- 2. On your new phone, tap Transfer my Data.
- 3. Tap continue, and switch Bluetooth on.
- **4.** Select your old phone from the list of found devices, and follow the instructions shown on both phones.

If your contacts are written in a language that is not supported by your new phone, the contact info may not be shown correctly.

If you don't yet have the Transfer my Data app, you can download it from **www.windowsphone.com**.

#### Transfer content using your Microsoft account

If your old phone is a Windows Phone, the easiest way to transfer your contacts, calendar, and text messages to your new Lumia phone is your Microsoft account.

If you don't have a Microsoft account set up on your new Lumia phone yet, on the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, tap **ALL SETTINGS** > **email+accounts** > **add an account**, and create a Microsoft account following the instructions shown on the screen.

1. To select what you want to back up to your Microsoft account, on your previous Windows Phone device, tap Settings > backup.

Your contacts and calendar are backed up automatically to your Microsoft account.

**2.** On your new Lumia phone, sign in to your Microsoft account. Your contacts, calendar, and text messages are automatically transferred to your new Lumia phone.

#### **Transfer content using OneDrive**

Upload your Office documents, photos, and videos to OneDrive to easily transfer them from your old phone to your new Lumia phone.

To easily upload and manage your content in OneDrive, download and install the OneDrive app from:

- Google Play for an Android phone
- · iTunes Store for an iPhone
- Store for Windows Phones (if not already in phone)
- Mac App Store for an Apple Mac
- · support.microsoft.com for your PC

You need a Microsoft account to sign in to OneDrive.

OneDrive may not be available for all phone models.

- **1.** On your old phone, open the OneDrive app.
- 2. Tap ①, and select what you want to upload.
- 3. Select upload.

You can now sign in to OneDrive with your Microsoft account to access your content on any device and download it when you need it.

**Tip:** To transfer Office documents, you can also save them directly to OneDrive. To access your documents, on your new Lumia phone, tap **1** Office > OneDrive.

Using services or downloading content, including free items, may cause the transfer of large amounts of data, which may result in data costs.

#### Transfer content from a Symbian or S40 phone

Use Nokia Suite to transfer your contacts, calendar entries, and photos from a Symbian or S40 phone to your Lumia phone.

Make sure you have the latest Nokia Suite installed on your PC. You can download it from www.microsoft.com/mobile/nokiasuite.

You need a Microsoft account to sign into OneDrive.

- 1. Use a compatible USB cable to connect your Symbian or S40 phone to your PC.
- 2. Open Nokia Suite on your PC.
- **3.** Select **Copy content to Nokia Lumia**, and follow the instructions shown on your computer. Your files are copied to OneDrive. Your photos are copied to the Pictures folder in OneDrive, and your contacts and calendar events to your Outlook.com.
- **4.** To access your photos, on your Lumia phone, swipe left, and tap **OneDrive**. Your contacts and calendar events are synced automatically.
- Tip: Your Symbian or S40 phone doesn't support Nokia Suite? Or want to transfer other content, such as your videos? You can also connect your phone to your computer and drag and drop the files you want to transfer onto your computer. If you have the OneDrive desktop app, drag and drop the files straight to the OneDrive folder for automatic upload.

### Transfer Outlook info from an Android phone or iPhone

Use your Microsoft account to transfer your Outlook contacts, calendar entries, and to-dos from your Android phone or iPhone to your Lumia phone.

You need a Microsoft account to sync your Lumia phone with Outlook.com.

- 1. Use a compatible USB cable to connect your phone to your computer.
- **2.** On your computer, set the appropriate sync software, such as Samsung Kies, HTC Sense, Sony PC Companion, or iTunes, to sync the items to Outlook, and sync contacts, calendar entries, and to-dos from your phone to your computer.
- **3.** In Outlook, add the Microsoft account to Outlook using Microsoft Outlook Hotmail Connector. Go to **www.office.microsoft.com**, search for Hotmail Connector, and download it to your computer. You may need to configure the Hotmail Connector settings.
- **4.** Sync the content you want from Outlook to your Microsoft account. It may take a while before the content is available on your Microsoft account.
- **5.** To sync the content to your Lumia phone, simply sign into your Microsoft account.

# **Basics**

Learn how to get the most out of your new phone.

### What's new in this release?

Check some of the key things in this release at a glance.

- Find the settings you're looking for easily settings are now reorganized into groups, and you can even search them.
- Switch your calendar to show week numbers in the monthly view.
- Turn mobile data on and off easily add a shortcut to the action center.
- Cortana supports new languages: French, German, Italian, and Spanish.

# Get to know your phone

Your phone has two views, start screen and apps menu. To switch between the views, simply swipe left or right.



Start screen: The animated live tiles show your missed calls and received messages, the latest news and weather forecasts, and more. Updates of your pinned contacts are shown on the tile, and you can view your contacts' details directly from the start screen.


Apps menu: All your apps are listed here, all neatly ordered. If you have a lot of apps, to look one up, tap ②.

To access the Windows Phone software license terms, select Settings > about. Please read the terms. Note that by using the software, you accept the terms. If you do not accept the terms, do not use the device or software. Instead contact Microsoft Mobile or the party from which you purchased the device to determine its return policy.

#### Switch between views and apps

Not all your apps are on the start screen – swipe to the apps menu to find them. Or check what's already running on your phone and switch between the apps.


To see all the apps on your phone, on the start screen, simply swipe left. To return to the start screen, swipe right.



**Tip:** To find an app quickly, tap any letter in the apps menu, and in the following menu, tap the first letter or character for the app you want.

### View, switch between, and close open apps

To view the open apps, tap and hold the back key  $\leftarrow$ . To switch the app, swipe to the app you want, and tap the app. To close the apps you no longer need, tap  $\otimes$ .




#### Navigate the settings menu

On the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, and tap **ALL SETTINGS**. To go to a settings group, tap any settings group title, and select the group you want. To search for a particular setting, tap ②, and start typing the name of the setting.

### Personalize the navigation bar

All Lumia phones have 3 keys across the bottom: the back, start, and search key. You can change the way this navigation bar behaves – or even hide it from the start screen when you don't need it.

To hide the navigation bar from the start screen when it's not needed, swipe up from the bottom of the screen. To see the navigation bar again, swipe up.



#### Change the navigation bar color


You can change the navigation bar color to make it pop out better, or even match your theme. On the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, tap **ALL SETTINGS** > **navigation bar**, and change the setting for **Navigation bar**.

### Check notifications on your phone

You can quickly check notifications, change some settings, or add shortcuts to some apps in the action center that opens from the top of the screen.

The notification icon shows you have unread notifications.

**1.** Swipe down from the top of the screen.



In this screen, you can:

- See your missed calls and recent unread emails and messages
- Check any notifications, such as available app updates in Store
- Open apps
- · Check for Wi-Fi networks, and connect to them
- · Quickly jump to settings
- 2. To close the menu, swipe up from the bottom of the screen.

#### Personalize the action center

On the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, and tap **ALL SETTINGS** > **notifications+actions**. To change a shortcut, tap the shortcut and the app you want. You can also select which notifications you want to receive and how.

# Change the volume

If you have trouble hearing your phone ringing in noisy environments, or calls are too loud, you can change the volume to your liking.

Use the volume keys. The maximum volume level is 10.



By default, the volume keys control the volume of alarms and reminders.

If you have connected headphones, the volume keys control both ringtone and media volume at the same time. The maximum volume level is 30.

#### Change the volume for media and apps

Press a volume key, tap  $\checkmark$ , and tap the volume bar for media and apps to set the volume you want. The maximum volume level is 30.

#### Switch to silent mode

Press a volume key, and tap  $\checkmark$  >  $\clubsuit$ . To switch silent mode off, tap  $\clubsuit$ .



**Tip:** If you don't want your phone to vibrate, tap ♠. To change other sound settings, on the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, and tap **ALL SETTINGS** > **ringtones+sounds**.

### Use your phone in airplane mode

In places where you don't want to make or receive calls, you can still access your music, videos, and offline games if you switch airplane mode on.

Airplane mode closes connections to the mobile network and turns your device's wireless features off. Comply with the instructions and safety requirements given by, for example, an airline, and any applicable laws and regulations. Where allowed, you can connect to a Wi-Fi network to, for example, browse the internet or turn Bluetooth and NFC sharing on in airplane mode.

- 1. On the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, and tap **ALL SETTINGS** > **airplane mode**.

### Icons shown on your phone

The status bar at the top of the screen tells you the current time, battery and signal strength, and much more.



**Tip:** To see hidden icons, tap the status bar.

Mobile signal strength

- Signal strength
- Your phone isn't connected to a mobile network.
- There is no SIM card in your phone.

- Your SIM card is locked.
- + Airplane mode is switched on.
- A Your phone is roaming outside your home mobile network.

Mobile data connection

Single letters, combinations of letters, or combinations of letters and numbers show the type of mobile network to which you're connected.

Icons that show the network connection type may vary between regions and network service providers.

- E An EDGE data connection is open.
- **G** A GPRS data connection is open.
- **4G** Your phone is connected to a 4G network.
- LTE An LTE data connection is open.
- Data is transferred over a mobile data connection.

Wi-Fi connection

- A Wi-Fi connection is available.
- A Wi-Fi connection is active.
- (1) A mobile data connection is shared with other devices over Wi-Fi.
- Data is transferred over Wi-Fi.

Battery

- Battery power level
- The battery is charging.
- Battery saver mode is switched on.

### Benefits of creating a Microsoft account

# **Create your Microsoft account**

Spice up your life and get more from your phone – create a Microsoft account. If you didn't create a Microsoft account during the first start-up, you can always do it later.



If you already have an Xbox Live.com, Hotmail.com, or Outlook.com account, or if you have created a Microsoft account on your Surface tablet or Windows PC, you don't have to create a new one – just sign in with the username and password for that account. If you don't have a Microsoft account yet, you can create one with your phone.

- 1. On the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, and tap ALL SETTINGS > email +accounts > add an account.
- 2. Tap Microsoft account.
- **3.** Create your Microsoft account.

Make sure you remember the credentials for the Microsoft account you added to your phone. You need them if you want to change the device protection settings or reset your phone.

- **4.** Fill in your account details.
- **5.** Type in your phone number or an alternative email address. They are used to send you a one-time verification code and to protect your data.
- 6. Select how you want to get your one-time verification code.
- 7. When asked, type in the last 4 digits of your phone number or your email address.
- **8.** When you receive the code, type it in, and you are ready to back up your data and use your phone.

Parents must approve the account for children under the age of 13. To approve the account, on the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, tap **ALL SETTINGS** > **email** +**accounts** > **Microsoft account**, and follow the instructions shown on the phone.



# Add a Microsoft account to your phone

If you didn't sign in to your Microsoft account during the first start-up, you can add the account to your phone later and get your data and settings easily on all your devices.

- 1. On the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, and tap ALL SETTINGS > email +accounts > add an account.
- 2. Tap Microsoft account.
- 3. Sign in with your existing Microsoft account username and password.
- **4.** Select how you want to get your one-time verification code.
- **5.** When asked, type in the last 4 digits of your phone number or your email address.
- **6.** When you receive the code, type it in.

Your data and settings are synced to your phone.



#### Set up My Family

If you want to restrict your kids from downloading paid or age-rated content from Store or games store, set up My Family.

- **1.** Go to **https://www.windowsphone.com/family**, and log in to your Microsoft account.
- 2. Add the account you want to My Family.
- **3.** Change the settings for your kid's account.



#### OneDrive

Learn what OneDrive is and how to use it.

#### OneDrive cloud storage

Store your stuff in the clouds. You don't need to worry about freeing memory for your favorite or new apps.



OneDrive is cloud storage for all your documents and photos, so you can access, share, or restore them if needed. You can also set it to back up your stuff automatically, so when you take a photo or a video, it's copied to your cloud album.

With OneDrive, you can access your photos, documents, and more from your phone, tablet, or computer. Depending on the app, you can even continue working on a document right from where you left it earlier.

There are several places where you can access your stuff on OneDrive. You can save photos to OneDrive in the Photos hub, or manage your office documents in the Office hub.

#### Save your photos and other stuff to OneDrive

You can upload files saved on your phone to OneDrive for easy access from your phone, tablet, or computer.

You need a Microsoft account to connect to OneDrive.

Tap CneDrive.

### Upload a photo

Tap 

and the photo you want to upload.



**Tip:** To set your phone to automatically upload your future photos or videos to OneDrive, on the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, tap **ALL SETTINGS** > **photos+camera** > **OneDrive**, and choose how to upload.

### Save an Office document to OneDrive

Tap **1** Office, swipe to places, and tap phone. Then tap and hold the file you want to save, and tap save to... > OneDrive.



**Tip:** You can also save a document to OneDrive while working on it. Tap ••• > save as..., and switch **Save to** to **OneDrive**. If you change the Save to location, it changes the default location for all files.

When you save your Office documents to OneDrive, you can continue working on the document right where you left it, on any device connected to your Microsoft account.

To save an Office document to your phone from OneDrive, open the document you want, tap ••• > save as..., and switch Save to to phone.

#### Save a photo back to your phone from OneDrive

Tap **Photos**, swipe to **albums**, tap **OneDrive**, select the folder and photos you want, and tap  $\textcircled{\textbf{a}}$ .

### Share your photos and documents between your devices

With OneDrive, you can easily access your photos, documents, and other stuff you have uploaded from any of your devices.

To upload your photos, documents, or other stuff saved on your phone, tablet, or computer to OneDrive, you need to sign in to your Microsoft account. To access the uploaded content on another device, you need to sign in to the same Microsoft account that was used when uploading the content.

To upload or download content, you need an internet connection. If you don't have a data plan, the data transmission costs may pile up quickly. For info about possible data costs, contact your network service provider.

There are several places where you can access your stuff on OneDrive. On your phone, you can check your photos and videos in the Photos hub, or open your Office documents in the Office hub. You can also download the OneDrive app from Store to see and manage all types of files on your phone.

On your tablet or computer, you can either manage your stuff online at **onedrive.com**, or you can use the OneDrive app and access OneDrive straight from your desktop. If you don't yet have the OneDrive app, you can download and install it from **onedrive.com**.



**Tip:** With the OneDrive app on your computer, you can simply drag and drop the files you want to upload to the OneDrive folder in the file manager, such as Windows Explorer or Finder, and the files are automatically uploaded to OneDrive.

#### Set up an account

Stay up to date – add your important accounts, such as social media or mail accounts, to your phone.

- 1. On the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, and tap ALL SETTINGS > email +accounts
- 2. Tap add an account and the name of the service, and follow the instructions shown.

# Personalize your phone

Learn how to personalize the start screen, and how to change ringtones.





#### Personalize the start screen

Make your start screen yours – choose your background photo, pin your favorite apps and much more to the start screen, or change the tile size and layout as you like. To get the most out of the space on the start screen, group apps into folders.

- **1.** To add a background photo, on the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, and tap **ALL SETTINGS** > **start+theme** > **choose photo**.
- 2. Tap a photo, crop it as you like, and tap ②.
- **Tip:** Why not match your background and tile colors with your background picture? Tap **Background** or **Accent color**. To share your theme and other settings to all your

Windows devices, on the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, tap **ALL SETTINGS** > **sync my settings**, and switch **theme** to **On** 

#### Move a tile

Tap and hold the tile, drag and drop it to the new location, and tap the screen.



### Resize or unpin a tile

To resize, tap and hold the tile, and tap the arrow icon.

The tiles can be either small, medium, or wide. The bigger the tile is, the more information it can show.



To unpin the tile, tap and hold the tile, and tap (x).

# **Group tiles into folders**

Tap and hold the tile, and drag and drop it on top of the tile or folder you want to group it with. To open an app from the folder, tap the folder, then tap the app you want. To change the name of the folder, tap and hold the name, and type in the name you want. To remove a folder, unpin the tiles in it.



#### Pin an app

Swipe left to go to the apps menu, tap and hold the app, and tap pin to start.

#### Pin a contact

Tap People, tap and hold the contact, and tap pin to start.

When you pin contacts, their feed updates are shown on the tile, and you can call them directly from the start screen.

#### Personalize the lock screen

Change the lock screen to your liking. You can, for example, have your own favorite photo in the background.



On the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, and tap **ALL SETTINGS** > **lock screen**.



**Tip:** You can decide which app notifications, such as missed calls or new messages, you want to see on the lock screen. Simply tap a notification slot, and choose the app you want to add

### Change the background photo

Tap **change photo**, select a photo, adjust it to get the best possible fit, and tap **(?)**.

**Tip:** You can also choose an app to show info on your lock screen, or let Bing shuffle \* photos there. Just change the setting for **Background** to your liking.

# Change the glance screen settings

To save power, your screen goes on standby when you're not using your phone actively. With the glance screen, you can easily check the time even when your screen times out.


- 1. On the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, and tap ALL SETTINGS > Glance screen.
- 2. Choose the time the glance screen stays on.

### Switch night mode on

In the glance screen settings, change the setting for **Night mode** to your liking. First, select the color for the text on the glance screen, or hide the glance screen completely for a certain time period. Then set the time when you want to have night mode on.

#### Create a safe, fun start screen for kids

You can let your kids use some apps on your phone without having to worry about them accidentally deleting your work mail, making online purchases, or doing anything else they shouldn't. Put selected apps, games, and other favorites for kids to enjoy in their own start screen



- 1. On the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, and tap ALL SETTINGS.
- 2. Tap kid's corner.
- **3.** Choose which content your kids can use. You can also set a password to keep your kids from accessing your own start screen.
- Tip: To let your kids make an in-app purchase, such as buy game points, define a Wallet PIN. You must type in the Wallet PIN to make each purchase. To define a Wallet PIN, tap Wallet > ••• > settings+PIN. Some purchases may not be available for all ages.

As Internet Explorer is not available in kid's corner, you don't have to worry about the websites your kids visit.

#### Go to your own start screen

Press the power key twice, and swipe up on your own lock screen. If you've set a password, type it in.

#### Go back to the kid's start screen

On your own lock screen, swipe left, and on the kid's lock screen, swipe up.

#### Switch the kid's start screen off

On the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, tap **ALL SETTINGS**, and switch **kid's corner** to **Off** 

# Personalize your phone tones

Change the notification tones your phone uses for calls, messages, and more, or add your own tones or your favorite song to the collection.

- 1. On the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, and tap **ALL SETTINGS** > **ringtones+sounds**.
- 2. Select the type of ringtone or alert you want to change, and select the sound. To listen to a ringtone so you can see if you like it, tap ①.
- **Tip:** Want to set a specific ringtone for a contact so you immediately know when they are calling? Edit the contact info in the People hub.

# Change the message tone or other notification sounds

Tap **manage app sounds** and the app you want, and select the notification sound.

# Add new ringtones from your PC to your phone

Connect your phone to your PC with a USB cable, and use the file manager of your PC to move the song you want to the ringtone folder in your phone. Your PC must have Windows Vista, Windows 7, Windows 8, or later.

To set the song as your ringtone, in the ringtones+sounds view, tap **Ringtone**, and under **Custom**, tap the song.

You can use a song as your ringtone if it is not protected with digital rights management (DRM), and it's smaller than 30 MB.

**Tip:** Want to create your own unique ringtone? Tap **a Store**, and download the Ringtone Maker app.

### Switch your phone to silent mode

When you switch silent mode on, all ringtones and alert tones are muted. Use this when you are, for example, at the theater or in a meeting.

Press a volume key to see the volume status bar at the top of the screen, and tap  $\checkmark$ .



To switch to silent mode, tap A.

**Tip:** Don't want to keep your phone in silent mode but can't answer right now? To silence an incoming call, press the volume down key. If you have switched Flip to silence on. you can simply turn your phone face down. To switch Flip to silence on, on the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, tap ALL SETTINGS > audio, swipe left, if needed, and switch Flip to silence to On  $\blacksquare$  $\square$ .

Let Cortana make your daily life easier.

### Cortana voice assistant

Keep your busy life in check - Cortana is your personal assistant on your phone, only a word away.

Cortana can help you:

- Schedule a meeting
- Set a reminder for an important task
- Send automatic replies for callers when you don't want to be disturbed
- Check your location
- Get up-to-date traffic and weather info, and much more

You can do all this using your voice, with only a minimum of fiddling with the touch screen to distract you from other activities.

You need a Microsoft account to use Cortana.

Cortana is not available in all regions and languages. For info on the supported languages, go to www.windowsphone.com.

#### Set up Cortana

Tell Cortana a little bit about yourself, so it can better help you find what you're looking for.

You need a Microsoft account to use Cortana.

- 1. Tap O Cortana.
- 2. Follow the instructions shown on your phone.

To later change your settings, such as your name, tap  $\equiv$  > **settings**.

### Install a speech language

Depending on your region and Cortana version, you may need to download and install the appropriate speech language to use Cortana. On the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, and tap **ALL SETTINGS** > **speech**. Under **Speech language**, select the language, and follow the instructions. For more information, go to **www.windowsphone.com**.

After you have installed the language, you must update your phone software.

#### **Use Cortana**

If you've got your hands full, but need to use your phone, you can use your voice to make a call, schedule a meeting, search the web, or open an app.

Tap the search key  $\mathcal{Q}$ .

Tap **♣**, say what you want to do, and follow the instructions shown on your phone.

**Tip:** To open the Cortana voice assistant quickly, tap and hold the search key **Q**.

**Example:** Say **Make an appointment**, and see what happens.

### Use your phone with ease

- 1. On the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, and tap **ALL SETTINGS**.
- 2. Tap ease of access.



### Magnify the screen

Switch **Screen magnifier** to **On** [\_\_\_\_], and double-tap the screen with 2 fingers. When using the magnifier, use 2 fingers to move around the screen. To stop magnification, double-tap the screen with 2 fingers.



# Use your phone with a TTY/TDD

Switch TTY/TDD to full.

The available TTY/TDD modes may vary depending on your network service provider.

# Use your phone with a hearing aid Switch Telecoil to On

To check the Hearing Aid Compatibility rating for your phone, go to **aka.ms/ phoneaccessibility**.

#### Use the screen reader

Narrator reads the info on your screen aloud.

Not all languages are supported, and you may need to download additional language packages.

- 1. On the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, tap **ALL SETTINGS** > **ease of access**, and switch **Narrator** to **On**
- **2.** To hear the names of the items on the screen, move your finger on the screen. To open an item, double-tap the item.

When Narrator is switched on, some touch screen actions, such as swipe, are disabled.

### Unlock the keys and screen when using the screen reader

Press the power key to wake up the screen, then double-tap the start key

#### Close the screen reader

Press the start key **■** and the volume up key at the same time to switch Narrator off or back on.

### Take a screenshot

You can take screenshots of what's on your phone screen and use them like any photos.

**1.** Press the volume up key and the power key at the same time.



**2.** To view or manage the screenshots you've taken, tap **Photos** > **albums** > **Screenshots**.

# **Extend battery life**

Get the most out of your phone while getting the battery life you need. There are steps you can take to save power on your phone.

To save power:

Charge wisely	Always charge the battery fully.
Select only the sounds that you need	Mute unnecessary sounds, such as key press sounds. On the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, tap <b>ALL SETTINGS</b> > <b>ringtones</b> + <b>sounds</b> , and select which sounds to keep.
Use wired headphones	Use wired headphones, rather than the speakerphone.
Use Battery Saver	You can set your phone to automatically save power when the battery charge level is low. To check the battery status, and to switch Battery Saver on, tap Battery Saver.
	When your phone goes into battery saver mode, you may not be able to change the settings of all apps.
Change the phone screen settings	<ul> <li>Set the phone screen to switch off after a short time. On the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, and tap ALL SETTINGS &gt; lock screen &gt; Screen times out after.</li> <li>Change the glance screen settings. To shortly see the time and your notifications when moving your phone, on the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, tap ALL SETTINGS &gt; glance screen, and switch Glance screen to peek. To switch glance screen off, switch Glance screen to off.</li> </ul>

To switch the NFC feature off, on the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, tap ALL SETTINGS &gt; NFC, and switch Tap to share to Off .</li> <li>Use a Wi-Fi connection to connect to the internet, rather than a mobile data connection.</li> <li>Stop your phone scanning for available wireless networks. On the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, tap ALL SETTINGS &gt; WiFi, and switch WiFi networking to Off .</li> <li>If you're listening to music or otherwise using your phone, but don't want to make or receive calls, switch airplane mode on. # **Check battery use**

To check which apps have been eating up your battery life, tap **Battery Saver**, and swipe to **usage**.

# Save on data roaming costs

You can cut data roaming costs and save on your phone bills by changing mobile data settings. Data roaming means using your phone to receive data over networks that your network service provider doesn't own or operate. Connecting to the internet when roaming, especially when abroad, can raise data costs substantially. Your network service provider can charge you a fixed fee for data transfer or on a pay-as-you-use basis. To use the optimal connection method, change the Wi-Fi, mobile data, and email download settings.

Using a Wi-Fi connection is generally faster and less expensive than using a mobile data connection. If both Wi-Fi and mobile data connections are available, your phone uses the Wi-Fi connection.

On the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, and tap

- 2. Select the connection you want to use.

#### Close a mobile data connection

On the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, tap **ALL SETTINGS** > **cellular** +**SIM**, and switch **Data connection** to **off** 

Tip: You can also follow your data usage with the Data Sense app.

### Stop data roaming

On the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, tap **ALL SETTINGS** > **cellular** +**SIM**, and switch **Data roaming options** to **don't roam**.

**Tip:** To save on data costs when traveling, save new maps to your phone before your journey, and browse the maps offline. If you're running low on space, you can remove some maps from your phone.

#### **Download email less frequently**

In every mailbox you have, tap ••• > **settings** > **sync settings**, and select how often to sync.

### Write text

Learn how to write text quickly and efficiently with your phone's keyboard.

# Use the on-screen keyboard


Writing with the on-screen keyboard is easy. You can use the keyboard when holding your phone in portrait or landscape mode. You can write your messages by tapping the letters or by swiping through them.

Tap a text box.

- 1 Character keys
- 2 Shift key
- 3 Numbers and symbols key
- 4 Smiley key
- 5 Comma key
- 6 Space key
- 7 Enter key
- 8 Backspace key








**key when available**. You can add the comma key only if you have at least 2 keyboards installed on your phone.

# Swipe to write text

Swipe from the first letter of the word, and draw a path from letter to letter. Lift your finger after the last letter. To continue, keep on swiping without tapping the space key. Your phone adds the spaces.

Not all languages are supported.



### Switch between upper and lower case characters


Tap the shift key. To switch caps lock mode on, double-tap the key. To return to normal mode, tap the shift key again.

### Type in a number or special character

Tap the numbers and symbols key. To see more special character keys, tap the shift key. Some special character keys bring up more symbols. To see more symbols, tap and hold a symbol or special character.

 $\star$ 

**Tip:** To quickly type in a number or special character, while holding the numbers and symbol key, slide your finger to the character, and lift your finger.



### Copy or paste text

Tap a word, drag the circles before and after the word to highlight the section you want to copy, and tap ③. To paste the text, tap ⑥.

#### Add an accent to a character


Tap and hold the character, and tap the accent or the accented character, if supported by your keyboard.

#### Delete a character

Tap the backspace key.

### Move the cursor

To edit a word you just wrote, tap and hold the text until you see the cursor. Drag the cursor to the place you want.



**Tip:** To put a period at the end of a sentence, and to start a new sentence, tap the space key twice.

### Use keyboard word suggestions

Your phone suggests words as you write, to help you write quickly and more accurately. Word suggestions may not be available in all languages.

When you start writing a word, your phone suggests possible words. When the word you want is shown in the suggestion bar, select the word. To see more suggestions, swipe left.


**Tip:** If the suggested word is marked in bold, your phone automatically uses it to replace the word you wrote. If the word is wrong, tap it to see the original word and a few other suggestions.

#### Correct a word

If you notice that you have misspelled a word, tap it to see suggestions for correcting the word.

### Add a new word to the dictionary

If the word you want isn't in the dictionary, write the word, tap it, and tap the plus sign (+) in the suggestion bar. Your phone also learns new words when you have written them a few times.



#### Turn word suggestions off

On the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, and tap **ALL SETTINGS** > **keyboard**. Tap your language keyboard, and clear the **Suggest text** check box.

#### **Empty the word suggestion list**

On the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, and tap **ALL SETTINGS** > **keyboard** > **advanced** > **reset suggestions** to remove all the words that you have added to the suggestion list.


#### Add writing languages

You can add several writing languages to your keyboard and switch between the languages when writing.

- 1. On the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, and tap **ALL SETTINGS** > **keyboard** > **add keyboards**.
- Select the languages you want to write in, and tap ⊙.
  - **Tip:** To remove a pre-installed keyboard, tap and hold the language you don't want to use, and tap **remove**.

# Switch between the languages when writing

Tap the language key repeatedly until the language you want is shown. The keyboard layout and word suggestions change according to the language selected. The language key is only shown when more than one keyboard has been installed.



#### Scan codes or text

Use your phone camera to scan things, such as QR codes, barcodes, and book and DVD covers, and get further info on what your phone recognizes.

Tap the search key  $\Omega$ , and tap  $\odot$ .

If your phone has Cortana, tap Lumia Camera > > Lenses > .

- **1.** Point the camera at a code.
- 2. Tap a result for more info.
- **Tip:** Keep the camera steady, and make sure what you're scanning is completely visible in the camera viewfinder.
- **Example:** Try scanning the following code, and see what happens.



#### Translate or search for text on the web

Point the camera at the text, tap **scan text** and the words you want, and tap **translate** or **search**.

This feature may not be available in all languages.

### Clock and calendar

Keep track of time – learn how to use your phone as a clock, as well as an alarm clock, and how to keep your appointments, tasks, and schedules up to date.

#### Set an alarm

You can use your phone as an alarm clock, and even set your favorite song as your alarm tone.



Tap 6 Alarms.

- 1. Tap (+).
- 2. Set the time, fill in the alarm details, and tap (a).
- **Tip:** Too tired to fiddle with the phone much? Tap and hold the search key  $\Omega$ , and tell Cortana when you need the alarm.

For the alarm to sound, your phone must be turned on.

**Tip:** You can quickly see the time of the next active alarm if you have pinned the Alarms app to the start screen. The tile size must be at least medium.

# Use your favorite song as your alarm tone

Connect your phone to your PC with a USB cable, and use the file manager of your PC to move the song you want to the ringtone folder in your phone. To set the song as your ringtone, on the start screen of your phone, swipe down from the top of the screen, tap **ALL SETTINGS** > **ringtones+sounds** > **Ringtone**, swipe to **Custom**, and tap the song.

You can use a song as your ringtone if it is not protected with digital rights management (DRM), and it's smaller than 30 MB.

Your PC must have Windows Vista, Windows 7, Windows 8, or later.

#### Snooze an alarm

If you don't want to get up just yet, when the alarm sounds, tap **snooze**. Before snoozing, you can change the snooze time.

**Tip:** Tapping the back key **—** snoozes the alarm for 2 minutes.

#### Turn an alarm off

Tap 6 Alarms, and switch the alarm to Off .......

#### Delete an alarm

Tap the alarm and (1).

#### Add an appointment

To remember an appointment, add it to your calendar.

### Tap Calendar.

- 1. Tap (+).
- **2.** Type in the details you want, and set the time.
- **3.** To add, for example, the duration, reminder, or recurrence for the event, tap **more details**.
- 4. When done, tap (A).
- **Tip:** To edit an event, tap and hold the event you want, tap **edit**, and edit the details you want.

### Send a meeting invitation

When creating an event, tap **more details** > **add someone** >  $\bigcirc$ , select the contacts you want, and tap  $\bigcirc$ .

You can send meeting invitations to contacts who have a mail address.

#### Create an event on another calendar

By default, your events go to your Microsoft account calendar. If you have, for example, a shared calendar with your family, you can create and share the event instantly. To change the calendar when creating the event, tap **more details** > **Calendar** and the calendar you want to use.

**Example:** You can create an event to a calendar you are sharing with other people, such as your work calendar, so they know when you are busy.

#### Change your status for an event

When you want to let others know when you're busy or out of the office, tap **more details** > **Status** and the status you want. By default, your status is **free**.

### Delete an appointment

Tap and hold the appointment, and tap **delete**.

#### Switch between calendar views

See your appointments for the day or week at a glance, or easily plan when to have your vacation – browse through your calendar in different views.

# Tap 🔼 Calendar.

1. To switch between the daily, weekly, monthly, and yearly views, tap  $\textcircled{\text{@}}$ . In the weekly or monthly view, tap the day to see all your events.

- **2.** To switch between days, weeks, months, or years, swipe left or right. To quickly jump to a particular month of a given year, in the yearly view, swipe to the year you want, and tap the month.
- **Tip:** If you allow the calendar to use your location, you can also check the weather in the daily or weekly view.

### Turn week numbers on or off

Tap ••• > settings and the Enable week numbers check box.

The week numbers are shown in the monthly view.

#### Check your task list

Tap ••• > tasks.

### Add a task to your task list

Add tasks you need to remember, such as important deadlines to meet at work or library books to return, to your task list, and cross them out once completed. If you have a particular deadline, set a reminder.

Tap ☐ Calendar > ••• > tasks.

- 1. Tap (+), and fill in the fields.
- **2.** To add a reminder, switch **Reminder** to **On** \_\_\_\_\_\_, and set the reminder date and time.
- 3. Tap (A).

#### Edit or delete a task

Tap and hold the task, and tap edit or delete.

**Tip:** Feeling energetic? Or hands full and no time for extra tasks? To quickly bring the time of the event forward or postpone it, tap and hold the task, and select the option you want.

# Mark a task as complete

Tap and hold the task, and tap **complete**.

# Use multiple calendars

When you set up your mail or social networking accounts on your phone, you can sync the calendars from all your accounts in one place.

- 1. Tap Calendar.
- 2. To show or hide a calendar, tap ••• > settings, and turn the calendar on or off.

When a calendar is hidden, the calendar events and reminders are not shown in different calendar views.

The birthday calendar compiles the birthday info from your social networking accounts.

You can't add new calendars to your phone, but you can choose which calendars from your different accounts you want to see.

# Change the color for each calendar

Tap ••• > **settings**, and tap the current color and the new color.

# **Browse your SIM apps**

If your service provider has included apps on your SIM card, here's how to find them.

- 1. On the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, and tap **ALL SETTINGS** > **cellular+SIM**.
- 2. Tap the SIM.
- 3. Tap SIM applications.

### **Store**

Make your phone your own with more apps, games, and other items, some of which are free of charge. Browse Store to find the latest content for you and your phone.



You can download:

- Apps
- Games
- Entertainment apps and services
- · News apps and services
- Books

You can also:

- Get content that is relevant to your tastes and location
- Share recommendations with your friends

The availability of Store and the selection of items available for download depend on your region.

To download from Store, you need to be signed in to your Microsoft account on your phone. When you're signed in, you are offered content compatible with your phone.

You can search for and download content directly to your phone, or browse Store content on your computer and send links from there to your phone by text message.

Many items are free of charge; some you need to pay for with your credit card or on your phone bill.

The availability of payment methods depends on your country of residence and your network service provider.

Using services or downloading content, including free items, may cause the transfer of large amounts of data, which may result in data costs.

#### **Browse Store**

Check out the latest and most downloaded apps, games, and other items recommended for you and your phone. Browse different categories, or search for specific items.

### Tap 👸 Store.

- 1. Tap a category on the front page, or swipe left or right to see more categories and items.
- 2. Tap an item to view its details. When you view an item, related items are also shown.
- **Tip:** Did you find something in Store that you know your friends would be interested in? Tap **share** to send them a link.
  - **Tip:** Want to get personalized suggestions on which apps and games might interest you?

#### **Search Store**

Tap o, write your search words, and tap  $\longrightarrow$ .

# Download an app, game, or other item

Download free apps, games, or other stuff, or buy more content for your phone.

- 1. Tap Tap Store.
- 2. Tap an item to view its details.
- **3.** If the item has a price, tap **buy**, or to try the item for free for a limited time, tap **try**. If the item is free, tap **install**.

The availability of payment methods depends on your country of residence and your network service provider.

- **4.** If you're not signed in to your Microsoft account, sign in now.
- 5. Follow the instructions shown on your phone.
- **Tip:** If downloading fails, check that the time and date are set correctly.

When the download is complete, you can open or view the item, or continue browsing for more content. The content type determines where the item is stored in your phone: music, videos, and podcasts can be found in Music, Video, and podcasts, games can be found in Games, and apps can be found in the apps menu.

For more info on an item, contact the publisher of the item.

- **Tip:** Use a Wi-Fi connection to download large files.
- **Tip:** In the Store main view, you can see a notification at the top right corner of the screen on how many of your downloaded apps, games, and other content have updates.

If the app you've downloaded doesn't support your phone language, the app uses US English by default. If you've added more than one phone language and the app supports one of them, the app is downloaded in the supported language.

- **Tip:** You can also use your computer to browse Windows Phone Store and download content to your phone. Go to **www.windowsphone.com**, and browse or search for apps and games.
- Tip: If your kid has a Windows Phone 8.1, you can use the My Family website to manage their game and app downloads and settings. To set up My Family, go to <a href="https://www.windowsphone.com/family">https://www.windowsphone.com/family</a>, sign in to the Microsoft account with both your and the kid's mail address and password, and follow the instructions.

This feature is not available in all languages. For more info on feature and service availability, see the How-to section at **www.windowsphone.com**.

The availability of apps and games may depend on your kid's age.

#### See your ongoing and previous downloads

Tap **Store** > ••• > **downloads**, and swipe to **downloads** to see the ongoing downloads, or to **history** to see the previously downloaded apps, games, and other content.

#### View your ongoing downloads

While an item is downloading, you can continue to browse Store for other content and add items to be downloaded.

To view the status of your downloads, in the Store main view, tap •••• > downloads, and swipe to downloads to see the ongoing downloads, or to history to see the previously downloaded content.

- **Tip:** To check the status of the currently ongoing download, tap **check install**.
- **Tip:** If you need to, for example, temporarily close your internet connection, tap and hold the downloading item, and tap **pause**. To resume downloading, tap **resume**. Pause pending items individually. If a download fails, you can re-download the item.

# Write a review for an app

Share your opinion on an app with other Store users – rate and review the app. You can post one review per app that you download.

- 1. In the apps menu, tap and hold the app, and tap rate and review.
- 2. Rate the app, and write your review.
- **Tip:** You can rate and review your other items in the same way.

### Receive ads

If you want to receive ads and tips about apps that might interest you, on the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, tap **ALL SETTINGS**, and switch **advertising id** to **On**If you want to clear the info that your phone uses to find your relevant ads and tips, tap reset your advertising ID.

# People & messaging

Contact your friends and family, and share your files, such as photos, using your phone. Stay tuned with the latest updates to your social networking services even when on the go.

#### **Calls**

Learn how to make calls on your new phone and talk to your friends.

#### Call a contact

Calling your friends is quick and easy when you've saved them as contacts in your phone.

Tap 🐫.

- 1. Tap 📵.
- 2. Tap the contact and the number, if the contact has several numbers.
- **Tip:** Is your friend's voice too loud or quiet? Press the volume keys to change the volume.
- **Tip:** Want to let others hear the conversation? Tap **speaker**.

#### Call a phone number

Tap (i), type in the phone number, and tap call.

To type in the + character, used for international calls, tap and hold 0.

The + character only works from abroad. The + character may not work in all regions. In this case, enter the international access code directly.

# Search your call history

To search for a call record, swipe to **history**, tap ②, and type in the contact's name or phone number.

#### Remove a call record

To remove a call record, swipe to **history**, tap and hold the call record, and tap **delete**.

To remove all the call records, tap ••• > select calls > ••• > select all >  $\hat{\mathbf{n}}$ .

# Copy and paste a phone number

On the start screen, tap People, swipe to contacts, tap a contact, tap and hold the phone number, tap copy, and in a text box, tap (6).

# Make a call with Skype

You can use your phone to make Skype-to-Skype calls and video calls. With Skype global rates, you can also call landlines or other mobile phones. Pay as you go with your credit card, or get a monthly subscription for the best rates.

If you don't yet have the Skype app, you can download it from **www.windowsphone.com**.

Tap [S] Skype, and sign in with the same Microsoft account that you use with your phone.

To call a Skype contact, swipe to **people**, tap the contact you want to call, and tap **(**).

For more information on Skype-to-Skype calls, see the video at www.youtube.com/watch? v=AF2HRYdPnAM (in English only).



**Tip:** To save on data costs, use a Wi-Fi network connection with Skype whenever possible.

### Make a video call with Skype

Swipe to **people**, tap the contact you want to call, and tap .

If your phone does not have a front camera, you can use the main camera for video calls.

#### Make a Skype call with Cortana

Tap and hold the search key **Q**, and say **Skype call** or **Skype video call**, followed by the name of the contact.

Cortana is not available in all regions and languages. For information on the supported languages, go to **www.windowsphone.com**.

### Use speed dial to call your favorite contacts

Call your most important contacts quickly with 1-touch dial.

- **1.** Tap **(**, and swipe to **speed dial**.
- 2. To add a contact to speed dial, tap 

  and the contact you want to add.
- 3. To call a contact you have added to speed dial, in the speed dial view, tap the contact.

#### Call the last dialed number

Call your friend again if you forgot to say something. In the call history view, you can see info about the calls you have made and received.

- 1. Tap <a> and swipe to history</a>.
- **2.** Tap the name or phone number.

# Use your voice to make a call

You can use your voice to call a contact.

- 1. Tap and hold the search key  $\Omega$ .
- 2. Say Call and the contact's name.
- **Tip:** You can also use voice dialing with a Bluetooth headset.



### Silence an incoming call

If your phone rings when you don't want to be disturbed, you can silence the ringtone for that call.

If you want to be able to silence your phone by turning it face down, the Flip to silence feature must be switched on. On the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, tap **ALL SETTINGS** > **audio**, swipe left, if needed, and switch **Flip to silence** to **On** 

When someone calls you, press the volume key or the lock key. You can also turn your phone face down.



# Reply to a call by a text message

If you can't speak right now, you can reply to the caller by a text message.

- 1. When someone calls you, tap **TEXT REPLY**.
- 2. Tap type a message..., and write your message.

You can only reply by a text message to calls from the contacts saved in your phone.

# Switch text reply on or off

Tap Tap

# Edit a pre-written text message

Tap 🚺 > ••• > settings > edit replies, and edit the reply you want.

#### Make a conference call

Your phone supports conference calls between 2 or more people. The maximum number of participants can vary, depending on your network service provider.

- **1.** Make a call to the first person.
- 2. To make a call to another person, tap 📞.

3. When the new call is answered, tap 1.

To add more people, tap C+ again.

### Have a private conversation with someone

Tap  $\triangleright$  and the person's name or phone number. The conference call is put on hold on your phone. The other people continue the conference call.

To return to the conference call, tap 1.

### Forward calls to another phone

When you know you can't answer the phone, you can forward incoming calls to another phone number.

For availability of this feature, contact your network service provider.

- 1. Depending on your phone, do either of the following:
- On the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, and tap ALL SETTINGS > network+ > set.
- Tap ( > ••• > settings.

Depending on your phone, you may also be able to make the choice separately for different situations, such as when you can't answer or when you're in a call.

**Tip:** To check if call forwarding is being used, shown by 😝, tap the top of the screen.

# Forward calls to your voice mail

Besides forwarding calls to another phone number, you can also forward these calls to your voice mail and listen to them later.

For availability of this feature, contact your network service provider.

Do either of the following, depending on your phone:

- Tap • • > settings. Switch Call forwarding to On \_\_\_\_\_, if needed, and type in the voice mail number given by your service provider, if needed.
- Swipe down from the top of the screen, tap ALL SETTINGS > network+ > set, and type
  in the voice mail number given by your service provider, if needed.

Depending on your phone, you may either forward all your calls to your voice mail, or make the choice separately for different situations, such as when you can't answer or when you're in a call.

**Tip:** If you want to avoid forwarding calls to your voice mail, type in another number, such as the number of your second phone. You can also contact your service provider about deactivating the voice mail service.

### Change your voice mail number

Tap ( > ••• > **settings**, and type in the new number.

### Call your voice mailbox

If you've forwarded incoming calls to your voice mailbox, you can call it and listen to the messages your friends have left.

- 1. Tap 🐧
- 2. Tap ⓐ. If asked, type in the voice mail password you received from your network service provider.
- **3.** You can listen or reply to voice mail messages, delete them, or record a greeting message.

For the availability of the voice mailbox service, and for info on setting up how long before calls are forwarded, contact your network service provider.

#### Use call waiting

Get another call while you're already in one? Call waiting helps you answer or hold one of the calls.

- 1. On the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, and tap **ALL SETTINGS** > **network+** > **set**.

Hold the first call and answer the new call Tap ANSWER.

End the first call and answer the new call Tap end call+answer.

Ignore the new call

Tap **IGNORE**.

Hold one call and make another

Tap **HOLD** > **ADD CALL**, and call the people you want.

Switch between calls

Tap **TAP TO SWAP**.

# **Block calls and messages**

If you are getting unwanted calls or text messages, you can block them with the call+SMS filter app.

To add a phone number to your blocked numbers list, on the start screen, tap , swipe to **history**, tap and hold the caller you want to block, and tap **block number...**.

You can also add numbers to your blocked numbers list from text messages.

On the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, and tap **ALL SETTINGS** > **call** +**SMS filter**.

Switch **Block calls+SMS** to **On** 

**Check which numbers are blocked** Tap **blocked numbers**.

# **Get notifications about blocked calls or messages**Tap **advanced**, and switch **Notifications** to **On**

### **Contacts**

You can save and organize your friends' phone numbers, addresses, and other contact information in the People hub. You can also get in touch with your friends through social networking services.



### People hub

The People hub is where all your friends' contact information is kept. It lets you stay in touch with the people who matter the most through groups. Your social networks are also here.

Go to contacts to see your friends' contact information from every account you have signed into. You can organize the list the way you like by filtering it by account or hiding the contacts without phone numbers. Your own contact card is also here.

Check out what's new to see your friends' social network status updates conveniently in one place.

Contact groups make it easy to see the status updates from only the people you want. You can also send emails or messages to all of them at once.

#### Add or delete a contact

Keep your friends with you. Save their phone numbers, addresses, and other info to the People hub.

Tap People, and swipe to contacts.

#### Add a contact

- 1. Tap (+).
- 2. If you're signed in to several accounts, select the account to which you want to save the contact.

You cannot save a contact to your phone only, it's always saved to an account.

- 3. Add the contact details, and tap (A).
- **Tip:** When editing a phone number, to see more special characters, tap and hold the period key. To add a short pause, tap the comma key, or to dial an extension, tap **X**.
- Tip: Your contacts are backed up automatically to your Microsoft account.

#### Edit a contact

Tap the contact and ②, and edit or add details, such as a ringtone or a web address.

#### Delete a contact

Tap the contact and ••• > delete.

**Tip:** If you want to delete multiple contacts quickly, on your computer, log in to **people.live.com** with your Microsoft account, and delete them there.

#### Filter your contacts list

If you don't want contacts from social networking services to show up in your contacts list, you can filter them out. In the contacts list, tap ••• > settings > filter contacts list and the accounts you want to show or hide.

#### Save a number from a received call

When you've received a call, you can easily save the number if it's not yet saved in your People hub. You can save the number in a new or existing contacts list entry.

- **1.** Tap **(**, and swipe to **history**.
- 2. Tap 🖨 next to a phone number, and tap 🖲.
- 3. Tap  $\widehat{+}$ , edit the phone number and phone number type, and tap  $\widehat{+}$ .
- 4. Edit other contact details, including the name, and tap (a).

# Save a number from a received message

When you've received a message, you can easily save the number if it's not yet saved in your People hub. You can save the number in a new or existing contacts list entry.

- 1. Tap Messaging.
- 3. Tap ①, edit the phone number and phone number type, and tap ②.
- **4.** Edit other contact details, including the name, and tap  $\blacksquare$ .

#### Search for a contact

If you need to contact a friend quickly, you don't have to scroll through all your contacts. You can search or jump to a letter or character in the contacts list. You can also use a voice command to call or send a message to a contact.

- **1.** Tap **People**, and swipe to **contacts**.
- 2. Tap ②, and start writing a name. The list filters as you write.
- **Tip:** Pin your most important contacts or contact groups to the start screen. Tap and hold a contact, and tap **pin to start**.

#### Jump to a letter or character in your contacts list

Tap any letter in the contacts list on the left, and in the following menu, tap the first letter or character for the name you want.

#### Use a voice command

In any view, tap and hold the search key  $\Omega$ , and say **Call** or **Text** and the contact's name. Not all languages are supported.

#### Link contacts

It sometimes happens that you have separate entries for the same contact from different social networking services or mail accounts. You can link multiple contacts so that their info is in a single contact card.

Tap People, and swipe to contacts.


- 1. Tap the main contact you want to link to and ...
- **2.** Tap **choose a contact** and the contact to be linked.

#### Unlink a contact

Tap the main contact and (3), and tap the contact to be unlinked and **unlink**.

### **Copy contacts**

Have your nearest and dearest instantly at your fingertips. Use the Transfer my Data app to easily copy your contacts, text messages, and pictures from your old phone. The app does not work with all phone models.



**Tip:** If your old phone is a Windows Phone device, or if you have previously backed up your contacts to your Microsoft account, to import your contacts from the service, just sign in to your account on your phone. The contacts are imported automatically.

Your old phone needs to support Bluetooth. The contacts on your old phone need to be stored in the phone memory, not on the SIM.

- 1. On your old phone, switch Bluetooth on, and make sure the phone is visible to other devices.
- 2. On your new phone, tap Transfer my Data.
- **3.** Tap **continue**, and switch Bluetooth on.
- **4.** Select your old phone from the list of found devices, and follow the instructions shown on both phones.

If your contacts are written in a language that is not supported by your new phone, the contact info may not be shown correctly.

If you don't yet have the Transfer my Data app, you can download it from **www.windowsphone.com**.

# Copy contacts from a SIM card

If you have contacts stored on your SIM card, you can copy them to your phone.

Make sure your SIM card is inserted.

- 1. Tap People.
- 2. Tap ••• > settings > import from SIM.
- **3.** To import all your contacts, tap **import**.

 $\star$ 

**Tip:** To select individual contacts, tap **clear**, and use the check boxes.

You can't save contacts to your new SIM card.

### Create, edit, or delete a contact group

You can create contact groups to send a message to several people at the same time, or to see social updates from just group members. For example, you can add family members to the same group and reach them quickly with the same message.

Tap People, and swipe to rooms.

- **1.** Tap (+) > **Group**.
- 2. Write a name for the group, and tap (a).
- 3. Tap (+) and a contact. To add another contact, tap (+) again.
- **4.** Tap **⊘**.
- ★ Tip: There is already a group called Best friends in your phone.

#### Add a new group contact

Tap the group, and tap ( > +) and a contact.

# Remove a contact from a group

Tap the group and (a). Tap the contact and **remove from group**.

### Rename a group

Tap the group and ••• > **rename**, and write the new name.

### Delete a contact group

Tap the group and ••• > **delete**.

# **View your Rooms**

The rooms feature is being discontinued, but you can still view your existing chats, calendars, photos, or notes.

After March 2015, the rooms feature on Windows Phone is no longer supported. You can still see your existing rooms and use your room photo albums, calendars, and notes on your phone. You can't create new rooms or make changes to existing rooms. You can still see your old room chats, but you and the other room members can't send or receive new room chat messages.

To view your existing rooms, tap **People**, and swipe to **rooms**.

#### Share a contact

You can easily share a contact with your friends.

- **1.** On the start screen, tap **People**, and swipe to **contacts**.
- Tap a contact and ••• > share contact > ♥.
- **3.** Select how you want to share, and follow the instructions.

### Change your profile photo

You can select your contact card photo on your phone. Pick a photo you just took or an existing profile photo from one of your social networking services.

- 1. Tap People, and swipe to contacts.
- **2.** At the top of your contacts list, tap your own photo.
- **3.** Tap your photo again, and either choose one of the offered photos, or tap **find another** to select a photo from Camera Roll.
- **4.** Drag the photo around to adjust the cropping, and tap  $\bigcirc$ .

### Social networks

Set up social networking services on your phone to keep in touch with your friends.

### Set up a social media account

Set up your social networking service accounts.

To download more social networking apps, tap a Store.

**Tip:** When you sign in to an account, the contacts in the account are automatically imported. To choose which accounts show up in your contacts list, on the start screen, tap People, swipe to contacts, and tap ••• > settings > filter contacts list.


### See your friends' status updates

Tap People, and swipe to what's new.

# Post your status

If you feel like reaching out to your friends, let them know what's on your mind. Post a status update to the social networking services that you use.

- **1.** Tap **People**, and swipe to **contacts**.
- 2. Tap your own contact card and post an update.
- **3.** Select the service to post to.
- **4.** Write your message.
- **5.** Tap **1.**



# Share a photo in social networking services

After you take a photo, upload it to the web so all your friends can see what you're up to.

- 1. Tap Photos.
- **2.** Browse your photo albums for the photo you want to share.

- 3. Tap and hold the photo, and tap share....
- **4.** Tap the social networking service where you want to upload the photo.
- 5. Add a caption if you want, and share or send your photo.

## Messages

Stay in touch with your friends with text or multimedia messages.

### Send a message

With text and multimedia messages, you can quickly contact your friends and family.

- 1. Tap Messaging.
- 2. Tap (+).

If you start writing a message and switch to another app before sending it, you can continue your message when you return to Messaging. Tap ••• > **drafts**. The draft message is deleted when sent.

- **3.** To add a recipient from your contacts list, tap  $\bigoplus$ , or start writing a name. You can also type in a phone number.
- **Tip:** To add several recipients, tap  $\oplus$  >  $\oplus$ , select the recipients you want, and tap  $\odot$ .
- **4.** Tap the message box, and write your message.
- Tip: To add a smiley, tap 🕲.
- **5.** To add an attachment, such as a photo, tap (1), and select the attachment.
- 6. To send the message, tap (3).

If you're unable to send a multimedia message, check the following:

- Your mobile subscription supports multimedia messages.

Only compatible devices can receive and show multimedia messages. Messages may look different in different devices.

## Forward a message

In **threads**, tap a conversation, tap and hold the message you want to forward, and tap **forward**.

Before forwarding the message, you can edit what's written or add or remove attachments.

## Forward multiple messages

In **threads**, tap a conversation and  $\bullet \bullet \bullet \bullet >$  **select messages**, tap the check boxes that appear next to the messages, and tap + to add a recipient.

### Read a message

You can see on the start screen when you've received a message.

You can view the messages between you and a contact in one conversation thread. The thread can contain text and multimedia messages.



- 1. Tap Messaging.
- 2. To read a message, tap a conversation.

Tip: To prevent others from accidentally seeing notifications about your messages on the lock screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, and tap ALL SETTINGS > lock screen > Choose an app to show detailed status > none.

If you're unable to open a multimedia message, check the following:

- Your mobile subscription supports multimedia messages.

You can send text messages that are longer than the character limit for a single message. Longer messages are sent as two or more messages. Your service provider may charge accordingly. Characters with accents, other marks, or some language options, take more space, and limit the number of characters that can be sent in a single message.

Using services or downloading content, including free items, may cause the transfer of large amounts of data, which may result in data costs.

#### Save an attachment

Tap the attachment, such as a photo, and tap ••• > save.

#### Delete a conversation

In **threads**, tap (a), select the conversation you want to delete, and tap (a).

#### Delete a single message in a conversation

In **threads**, tap a conversation, tap and hold the message you want to delete, and tap **delete**.

## Delete all messages in your phone

Tap (=) > ••• > select all > (1).

## Reply to a message

Don't keep your friend waiting – reply to the message straight away.

- 1. Tap Messaging.
- 2. In threads, tap the conversation containing the message.
- **3.** Tap the message box, and write your message.
- **4.** Tap 📵.

### Forward a message

In **threads**, tap a conversation, tap and hold the message you want to forward, and tap **forward**.

Before forwarding the message, you can edit what's written or add or remove attachments.

### Send a message to a group

If you frequently need to send a message to the same group of people, you can create a group in the People hub. This way you can reach them all with a single message or mail.

Tap People, and swipe to rooms.

- 1. Tap the group and text or send email.
- 2. Write and send your message.
- ★ Tip: To create a group, tap + > Group.

## **Chat using Skype**

You can use your phone to send Skype-to-Skype instant messages.

If you don't yet have the Skype app, you can download it from www.windowsphone.com.

- 1. Tap Skype.
- 2. Sign in with the same Microsoft account that you use with your phone.
- 3. Swipe to **people**, and tap the contact you want to chat with.
- 4. Write your message, and tap (1).

For more info on Skype-to-Skype instant messages, see the video at www.youtube.com/watch?v=AF2HRYdPnAM (in English only).

**Tip:** To save on data costs, use a Wi-Fi network connection with Skype whenever possible.


## Share your location in a Skype chat

While in a chat, tap > share location > .

### Send your location in a message

When you ask your friends to come and meet you, you can send them your location on a map.

This feature may not be available for all regions.



Your phone may ask you about using your location. You need to allow it to use this feature.

**1.** When writing a text message, tap (1) > my location.

Sending a message with an attachment may be more expensive than sending a normal text message. For more info, contact your service provider.

**2.** Tap 📵.

Your friends receive a message with a picture of where you are on the map.

## Send an audio message

Celebrate your friend's birthday with a song – send your song as an audio message.

- **1.** When writing a message, tap (9) > **voice note**.
- 2. Record your message, and tap done.
- **3.** Tap 📵.

## Use your voice to write a message

Too busy to write a message? Write and send a text message with your voice.

This feature is not available in all languages. For info on the supported languages, go to **www.windowsphone.com**.

You may also need to download a language package before you can use the feature. If asked to install a language package, on the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, tap ALL SETTINGS > speech > Speech language, tap the language you want, and wait for the download to finish.

To use this feature, you must be connected to the internet.

- 1. Tap and hold the search key  $\Omega$ .
- 2. Say **Text** and the contact's name.
- 3. Say your message, and follow the instructions you hear.

### Mail

You can use your phone to read and reply to mail when you're on the go.



On the start screen, tap .

To send and receive mail, you must be connected to the internet.

#### Add or delete a mailbox

If you use different mail addresses for business and leisure, no problem – you can add several mailboxes to your phone.

## Add your first mailbox

To set up mail in your phone, you must be connected to the internet.

If you didn't sign in to your Microsoft account during the first start-up, you can do it now. When you add a Microsoft account to your phone, a mail account is added automatically.

- **1.** Tap **☑**.
- **2.** Tap an account, and write your username and password.
- 3. Tap sign in.
- **Tip:** Depending on your mail account, you can also sync other items than just mails to your phone, such as your contacts and calendar.

If your phone doesn't find your mail settings, advanced setup can find them. For this, you need to know your mail account type and the addresses of your incoming and outgoing mail servers. You can get this info from your mail service provider.

To find out more about setting up different mail accounts, see the How-to section at **www.windowsphone.com**.

### Add a mailbox later

In your mailbox, tap ••• > add email account and an account, and sign in.



**Tip:** To add your Exchange work mail, contacts, and calendar to your phone, select **Exchange** as your account, write your work mail address and password, and tap **sign** in.

Your new mailbox appears as a new tile on the start screen.

#### **Delete a mailbox**

On the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, and tap **ALL SETTINGS** > **email** +**accounts**. Tap and hold the mailbox, and tap **delete**.

You cannot delete the first Microsoft mailbox you signed in with. You must reset your phone to do that.

## Add your Exchange mailbox to your phone

You don't need your computer to access your work mail, contacts, and calendar. You can sync the important content between your phone and a Microsoft Exchange server.

Exchange can be set up only if your company has a Microsoft Exchange server. In addition, your company IT administrator must have activated Microsoft Exchange for your account.

Before starting the setup, make sure you have the following:

- · A corporate mail address
- Your Exchange server name (contact your company IT department)
- Your network domain name (contact your company IT department)
- Your office network password

Depending on the Exchange server configuration, you may need to type in additional info during the setup. If you don't know the correct info, contact your company IT department.

- 1. On the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, and tap **ALL SETTINGS** > **email** +accounts.
- 2. Tap add an account > Exchange.
- 3. Write your Exchange mail address and password, and tap sign in.

During the setup, you can define which content and how often you want your phone to sync with the server. To sync additional content, change the Exchange account settings.

## Open mail from the start screen

With live mail tiles you can open mail directly from the start screen.

From the tiles, you can see the number of unread mails and if you've received new mail.



You can pin several mailboxes to the start screen. For example, dedicate a tile for business mail and another for personal mail. If you link several mailboxes into a unified inbox, you can open mail from all your inboxes in one tile.

To read your mail, tap the tile.

#### Send mail

Don't let your mail pile up. Use your phone to read and write mail on the go.

- **1.** Tap **☑**.
- 2. Tap (+) and an account, if you have linked inboxes.
- 3. To add a recipient from your contacts list, tap ⊕, or start writing a name. You can also write the address.
- **Tip:** To remove a recipient, tap the name and **Remove**.
- **4.** Write the subject and your mail.
- **Tip:** Your phone can help you write your mail faster. While writing, your phone suggests possible next words to complete your sentence. To add a word, tap a suggestion. To browse the list, swipe over the suggestions. This feature is not available in all languages.
- 5. To attach a photo, tap (1).
- **Tip:** You can also take a new photo while writing your mail. Tap **(a)**, take a photo, and tap **accept**.
- 6. Tap (19) to send the mail.

#### Send an Office document


Tap **1** Office, tap the document you want to send and ••• > share..., and select the mail account you want to use.

#### Read mail

If you're waiting for important news, you don't have to wait until you're at your desk. Use your phone to read your mails.

You can see when you have new mail on the start screen.

- **1.** Tap **☑**.
- 2. In your mailbox, tap the mail. Unread mail is marked in a different color.
- **Tip:** To zoom in or out, place 2 fingers on the screen, and slide them together or apart.



**Tip:** If a mail contains a web address, tap it to go to the website.

## Read mail in a conversation

In your mailbox, tap the conversation that includes the mail, and tap the mail. A conversation with unread mail is marked in a different color.

#### Save an attachment

With the mail open, tap the attachment, such as a photo, and it is downloaded to your phone. Tap and hold the attachment, and tap **save**. Not all file formats can be saved.

## Copy a link

With the mail open, tap and hold the web link, and tap copy link.

## Reply to mail

If you receive a mail that needs a quick answer, you can reply straight away using your phone.

- **1.** Tap **☑**.
- 2. Open the mail, and tap .
- **Tip:** To reply to the sender only, tap **reply**. To reply to the sender and all the other recipients, tap **reply all**.

#### Forward mail

Open the mail, and tap ( > forward.

#### Delete mail

When your mailbox is overflowing, delete some mails to free up space in your phone.

- 1. In your mailbox, tap to the left of the mails you want to delete.
- 2. Tap the check boxes that appear next to the mails, and tap (ii).

All the mails you selected are deleted. Depending on your mail account, the mail may be deleted from your mail server, too.

#### Delete one mail

Open the mail, and tap (1).

## View mails separately

Mails are grouped by title in conversations. A conversation also includes your replies. If you'd like to view all your mails separately, you can switch the conversations feature off.

- **1.** Tap **☑**.
- 2. Tap ••• > settings.
- 3. Switch Conversations to Off

### Send automatic replies

If you are on vacation or otherwise out of the office, you can send automatic replies to the mails that arrive during your absence.

- 1. Tap **≥** > ••• > settings > automatic replies.

## Use your voice to write a mail

Instead of using the keyboard, you can dictate your mail.

This feature is not available in all languages. For info on the supported languages, go to **www.windowsphone.com**.

- 1. Tap 🔼
- 2. Tap 

  and an account, if you have linked inboxes.
- **3.** To add a recipient from your contacts list, tap  $\bigcirc$ . You can also write the address.
- **4.** Tap **Subject:** > **()**, and say your subject.
- **5.** Tap the message box and ①, and say your message.
- 6. Tap 📵 to send the mail.

#### Link several mailboxes as a unified inbox

If you have more than one mail account, you can choose which inboxes you want to link together into one inbox. The unified inbox lets you see all your mail at a glance.

- **1.** On the start screen, tap a mailbox.
- 2. Tap ••• > link inboxes.
- 3. In the other inboxes list, tap the inboxes you want to link to the first one.
- **4.** Tap **rename linked inbox**, write a new name for the mailbox, and tap **⊘**.

The new unified inbox is pinned to the start screen.

#### Unlink unified inboxes

On the start screen, tap the unified inbox and ••• > linked inboxes. In the list, tap the inboxes you want to unlink and unlink.

## Camera

Why carry a separate camera if your phone has all you need for capturing memories? With your phone camera, you can easily take photos or record videos.

### Get to know Lumia Camera

When you want to take outstanding photos, Lumia Camera gives you full control.

With Lumia Camera, you can:

- Change each setting manually to your preference
- · Easily share your photos and videos
- · Record high-definition videos.
- Pick the best frame or create an action shot from a high-definition video with the Lumia Moments app
- Take lossless Digital Negative (DNG) photos

Depending on your phone, the features of the Lumia Camera app may vary.

To download the Lumia Camera app or check that you have the latest version, go to www.windowsphone.com. Lumia Camera may not be available for all phone models.

You can upload your photos to OneDrive for easy access from your phone, tablet, or computer.

# Open your camera quickly

Make sure you get to your camera in a flash when you need it – place a shortcut in the action center.

- 1. On the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, and tap **ALL SETTINGS** > **notifications+actions**.
- 2. To change a shortcut to open the default camera, tap the shortcut and
- 3. To turn the camera on quickly using the shortcut, swipe down from the top of the screen, and tap .
- **Tip:** To turn the camera on when your phone is locked, press the power key, swipe down from the top of the screen, and tap .

## Change the default camera

You can change the default camera app to whichever camera you prefer.

- 1. On the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, and tap **ALL SETTINGS** > **photos+camera**.
- **2.** Tap **Default camera app**, and select the camera you want.

Taking a photo or recording a video is quick and easy, as is sharing it with your friends.

## Take a photo

Shoot sharp and vibrant photos – capture the best moments in your photo album.

Depending on your phone, the features of the Lumia Camera app may vary.

To download the Lumia Camera app or check that you have the latest version, go to **www.windowsphone.com**. Lumia Camera may not be available for all phone models.

- 1. Tap **Lumia Camera**.
- Tip: To open the camera with Cortana, tap the search key  $\Omega$ , tap  $\psi$ , say **Open** camera, and follow the instructions. Cortana is not available in all regions and languages. For information on the supported languages, go to **www.windowsphone.com**.
- 2. To zoom in or out, slide your fingers apart or together.
- **3.** To focus the camera on a specific object, tap the object on the screen.
- **4.** To take the photo, tap **...**
- **Tip:** Why not try other cool Lumia apps to make the most of your photos? To reframe your photo while keeping the full-resolution original, or to apply filters and other special effects, use the Lumia Creative Studio app. To take great-looking selfies, use the Lumia Selfie app.

Keep a safe distance when using the flash. Do not use the flash on people or animals at close range. Do not cover the flash while taking a photo.

### View the photo in full-resolution view

To view the photo you just took, depending on your phone, do either of the following:

- Tap the round thumbnail at the corner of the screen.
- Tap

This full-resolution photo can only be viewed in Lumia Camera.

#### Record a video

Besides taking photos with your phone, you can also capture your special moments as videos.

### Take photos that seem alive

Living Images capture a brief moment of video with every photo you take, so they seem alive when you browse them in Camera Roll or Lumia Storyteller.

Make sure you have downloaded the latest version of the Lumia Camera app from Store.

- 1. Tap Lumia Camera > , and swipe to photo.
- 2. Switch Living Images to on.

### Save your photos and videos to a memory card

If there is a memory card in your phone, and your phone memory is filling up, save the photos you take and videos you record to the memory card.

For the best video quality, record videos to your phone memory. If you record videos to the memory card, it is recommended that the microSD card you use is a fast 4–128GB card by a well-known manufacturer.

- 1. Tap Storage Sense.
- 2. Switch Store new photos on my to SD card.

The photos you take from now on are saved to the memory card.

Use only compatible memory cards approved for use with this device. Incompatible cards may damage the card and the device and corrupt data stored on the card.

## Save the photos and videos you've taken earlier to a memory card

In the Photos hub, browse to a photo or video, tap 
and the photo or video, and tap 
save to SD card.

**Tip:** To quickly select all photos or videos in an album, browse to the album, and tap 

| > ••• > select all.

## Save location info to your photos and videos

If you want to remember exactly where you were when you took a particular photo or video, you can set your phone to automatically record the location.

On the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, and tap **ALL SETTINGS** > **photos** +camera > **Use location info**.

Location information can be attached to a photo or video, if your location can be determined using satellite or network methods. If you share a photo or video that contains location information, the location information may be shown to those who view the photo or video. You can turn off geotagging in the phone settings.

## Share your photos and videos

You can share your photos and videos quickly and easily for your friends and family to see.

- 1. Take a photo, or record a video.
- 2. On the start screen, tap **Photos**, browse to your photo or video, and tap it.
- 3. Tap ②, select how you want to share, and follow the instructions.

- **Tip:** To share several photos or videos at once, tap ⊜, select the photos or videos, and tap ⊚.
- Tip: To access your photos from all your devices, you can set up uploading to OneDrive. The OneDrive album is then available in the Photos hub when you view your photos. To set up the feature, on the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, and tap ALL SETTINGS > photos+camera. Under Auto upload, tap OneDrive, and select an option.

Using services or downloading content, including free items, may cause the transfer of large amounts of data, which may result in data costs.

Not all sharing services support all file formats or videos recorded in high quality.

Your phone gives you great control over your photo settings. Take exactly the kind of photo you like.

## Take photos like a pro

Unleash your full creative potential and take professional-looking photos. With Lumia Camera, you can manually adjust the camera settings both in camera and video mode.

- 1. Tap **Lumia Camera**.
- 2. To view the settings, drag to the left. To change a setting, slide your finger up or down on the slider. You can, for example, change Exposure compensation to control the amount of light in your photo.
- **3.** To close the settings, drag **to** to the right.
- 4. To take a photo, tap .....

## **Record high-definition videos**

When you want to keep your memories of the important events in your life crystal clear, remember to record them in high definition.

## Tap **Lumia Camera**.

Tap , swipe to video, tap Resolution, and select the resolution you want.

Depending on your phone, the highest available resolution is either 4K or Full HD.

### Frame your photos with ease

If you want to frame your shots professionally, you can use viewfinder grids and compose perfect photos.

- 1. Tap **Lumia Camera**.
- 2. Depending on your phone, do either of the following:
- Tap ••• > settings.
- Tap o, and swipe to general.
- 3. Switch Framing grids to, for example, golden ratio or rule of thirds.
- 4. To take the photo, tap 

  .

### Find the best moments in your video

After recording a high-definition video, you can find its best frames and save them as separate images. You can also create exciting action shots.

After recording a high-definition video, tap **Lumia Moments** and the video.

- 1. Tap CREATE ACTION SHOT.
- 2. To select a starting point for the action shot, tap the slider.
- 3. To select an end point for the action shot, tap the slider and ().
- **4.** To delete moving objects from the photo, tap the white circles at the bottom of the screen.
- **5.** To select which moving object you want to highlight, swipe left or right to move the circle at the bottom of the screen.
- Tip: To highlight all the moving objects, tap 🔊.
- **6.** To add a speed blur effect, tap (2).
- 7. To save the action shot in Camera Roll, tap (a).

#### Save the best frame

Tap **CHOOSE BEST FRAME**, tap the slider or swipe left or right to find the best frames in your video, and tap (a) to save the frame as a separate photo in Camera Roll.

You can save as many frames as you want.

- 3. Pick the areas you want to animate, and tap ②.
- 4. To save the animated photo, tap (a).

## Photos and videos

Here's how you view, organize, share, and edit your photos and videos.



### Photos hub

The photos you've taken or videos you've recorded with your phone are saved to the Photos hub, where you can browse and view them.



To find your photos and videos easily, mark your favorites, or organize them into albums.

### View photos

Relive those important moments – view the photos on your phone.

#### Tap Photos.

- **1.** To view a photo you've taken, swipe to **albums**, and tap **Camera Roll** and the photo.
- 2. To view the next photo, swipe left. To view the previous photo, swipe right.

#### Find photos by date and location

Tap ••• > settings > Group my photos by time and location.

#### Zoom in or out

Place 2 fingers on the screen, and slide your fingers together or apart.

**Tip:** To quickly zoom in or zoom back out, double-tap the photo.

## Mark a photo as a favorite

Mark your best shots as favorites, so you can find them easily in the favorites view in the Photos hub.

**1.** Tap **Photos** > **albums**, and browse to the photo.

If the photo is in an online album, you can download it to your phone.

- **2.** Tap • > **⊙**.
  - **Tip:** To quickly mark several photos as favorites, select the album where the photos are, tap (♠), select the photos, and tap (♠).

### View your favorites

In the Photos hub, swipe to favorites.

## Change the background in the Photos hub

If you have a superb shot that makes you feel good every time you look at it, you can set it as the background of the Photos hub.

- 1. Tap Photos.
- 2. Tap ••• > settings.
- 3. Switch Start Tile shows to single photo.
- **4.** Tap **choose photo**, and select a background photo.
- Tip: You can also set your phone to periodically change the photo automatically. Tap

  ••• > settings. Switch Start Tile shows to all photos or favorite photos, and tap
  shuffle now

### Create an album

To easily find photos of an occasion, a person, or a trip, organize your photos into albums according to subject, for example.

If your computer is a Mac, install the Windows Phone app from the Mac App Store.

- 1. Connect your phone to a compatible computer with a compatible USB cable.
- **2.** On your computer, open a file manager, such as Windows Explorer or Finder, and browse to the folder for photos.
- 3. Add a new folder, give it a name, and add photos to the folder.

The folder appears as an album in the albums view on your phone.

**Tip:** If your computer's operating system is Windows 7 or Windows 8 or later, you can also use the Windows Phone app. With Windows 7, you can download it from **www.windowsphone.com**.

#### Delete an album

Tap **Photos** > **albums**. Tap and hold an album, and tap **delete**.

When you delete an album from the phone, the photos in that album are also deleted. If you've copied the album to your computer, the album and the photos in it stay on your computer.

You cannot delete online albums from your phone.

### Create the stories of your life

Let your photos tell the stories of your life with Lumia Storyteller.

To download the Lumia Storyteller app or check that you have the latest version, go to **www.windowsphone.com**. Lumia Storyteller may not be available for all phone models.

Your phone needs access to your location info. To allow it, on the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, tap **ALL SETTINGS** > **location**, and switch **Location services** to **On** 

1. Tap **Em Lumia Storyteller**.

The photos you have taken are automatically collected together as stories. You must have taken at least 7 photos around the same time and in one place for the app to form a story.

- 2. To create a story yourself, tap (a), select the photos, and tap (b).
- **3.** To rename the story, tap the collection and the title, and write a new name.
- **4.** To view a photo in the story, tap the collection and the photo. To browse the other photos, swipe left or right.
- **Tip:** You can add captions to the photos in the story. Tap a photo and **add caption**. To view a caption, tap the photo.

## Locate your photo on a map

To see on a map where a photo was taken, place 2 fingers on the photo, and slide them together.

## Copy your photos to your computer

Use your computer's file manager to copy or move your photos to the computer.

If your computer is a Mac, install the Lumia Photo Transfer for Mac app from **www.microsoft.com/mobile/support/**.

**1.** Connect your phone to a compatible computer with a compatible USB cable.

- **2.** On your computer, open a file manager, such as Windows Explorer or Finder, and browse to your phone.
- **Tip:** Your phone is shown under portable devices as Windows Phone. To see the folders of your phone, double-click the name of the phone. There are separate folders for documents, music, photos, ringtones, and videos.
- **3.** Open the folder for photos, and select and copy the photos to your computer.

Take photo editing to the next level – add cool special effects to your favorite photos with Lumia Creative Studio.

To download the Lumia Creative Studio app or check that you have the latest version, go to **www.windowsphone.com**. Lumia Creative Studio may not be available for all phone models.

Tap Lumia Creative Studio and the photo you want to edit.

## Reframe your photo

Tap (5), and select the ratio or rotate your photo.

## Apply a filter

Maps helps you find specific locations and businesses.

Tap 🗃 Maps.

- **1.** Tap **2.**

To download and update maps, switch Wi-Fi networking on.

- 2. Select the country or region.

# Update an existing map

Tap check for updates.

## Delete a map

Tap **download maps**, tap and hold the map, and tap **delete**.

# **Positioning methods**

The availability, accuracy and completeness of the location information depend on, for example, your location, surroundings, and third party sources, and may be limited. Location information may not be available, for example, inside buildings or underground. For privacy information related to positioning methods, see the Microsoft Mobile Privacy Policy.

Wi-Fi positioning improves positioning accuracy when satellite signals are not available, especially when you are indoors or between tall buildings. If you're in a place where the use of Wi-Fi is restricted, you can switch Wi-Fi off in your phone settings.

The trip meter may not be accurate, depending on the availability and quality of your satellite connection.

Learn how to create wireless connections and browse the web while keeping your data costs down

## **Define internet connections**

If your network service provider charges you on a pay-as-you-use basis, you may want to change the Wi-Fi and mobile data settings to reduce your data costs. You can use different settings for roaming and at home.

Important: Use encryption to increase the security of your Wi-Fi connection. Using encryption reduces the risk of others accessing your data.

Using a Wi-Fi connection is generally faster and less expensive than using a mobile data connection. If both Wi-Fi and mobile data connections are available, your phone uses the Wi-Fi connection.

- 1. On the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, and tap ...
- **2.** Switch **WiFi networking** to **On**
- 3. Select the connection you want to use.

#### Use a mobile data connection

On the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, tap **ALL SETTINGS** > **cellular** +**SIM**, and switch **Data connection** to **on** 

Tip: Want to turn mobile data on and off easily? Add a shortcut to the action center. On the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, and tap ALL SETTINGS > notifications+actions. Tap one of the shortcuts, and tap cellular data.

#### Use a mobile data connection when roaming

On the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, tap **ALL SETTINGS** > **cellular** +**SIM**, and switch **Data roaming options** to **roam**.

Connecting to the internet when roaming, especially when abroad, can raise data costs substantially.

Data roaming means using your phone to receive data over networks that your network service provider doesn't own or operate.

**Tip:** You can also follow your data usage with the Data Sense app.

## Use your data plan efficiently

If you are worried about your data usage costs, the Data Sense app helps you find more efficient ways to use mobile data and track your usage. This app can cut off data connections entirely if needed.

- 1. Tap Table Data Sense.
- 2. Tap set limit, and choose the values you want.



**Tip:** When using Internet Explorer, you can save on data usage costs automatically. Tap ••• > settings > Data Sense savings, and select the setting you want.

## Web browser


Catch up on the news, and visit your favorite websites. You can use Internet Explorer 11 in your phone to view web pages on the internet. Your browser can also help warn you against security threats.

## Tap [6] Internet Explorer.

To browse the web, you must be connected to the internet.

#### Browse the web


No need for a computer – you can easily browse the internet on your phone.



- 1. Tap Internet Explorer.
- **2.** Tap the address bar.
- 3. Write a web address.
- **Tip:** To quickly write a web address suffix such as .org, tap and hold the suffix key on the keyboard, and tap the suffix you want.
- Tap →.
- Tip: To search the internet, write a search word in the address bar, and tap ->.

### Zoom in or out

Private browsing prevents your browser from storing browsing data, such as cookies, browsing history, and temporary internet files.

#### Switch between tabs

Tap n and the tab you want.

#### Close a tab

Tap (1) > (x).

## Change the browser mode

Small text on a website can be hard to read. Use your browser in mobile or desktop mode, or switch certain web pages to the reading view and set the font size to your liking.

- **1.** To set the browser to always use the mode you want, tap [ Internet Explorer > ••• > settings.
- **2.** Change the setting for **Website preference**.

## Switch to the reading view

Tap on the address bar. To set the font size for the reading view, tap ••• > settings > advanced settings > Reading view font size.

**Tip:** To learn more about the browser settings and what they do, tap the link at the bottom of the screen.

## Add a website to your favorites

If you visit the same websites all the time, add them to your favorites, so you can access them quickly.

### Share a web page using NFC

While browsing, tap ••• > share page > Tap to share (NFC), and touch your friend's phone with your phone.

To make sure Tap to share (NFC) is turned on, on the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, tap **ALL SETTINGS** > **NFC**, and switch **Tap to share** to **On** 

NFC is not supported by all phones. For availability, go to **www.microsoft.com/mobile/ support/wpfeatures**. This feature may not be compatible with all phones that support NFC.

The other phone must support NFC. For more info, see the user guide of the other phone.

## Clear the browser history

When you've finished browsing, you can delete your private data, such as your browsing history and temporary internet files.

A cache is a memory location that is used to store data temporarily. If you have, or have tried to, access confidential information or a secure service, requiring passwords, clear the cache after each use.

## Search the web

A copy is downloaded to your phone.

- **Tip:** To keep an offline copy of a document on your phone, tap and hold the document, and tap **always stay offline**.

#### Write a note

Notes on paper are easy to lose. Instead of jotting them down on paper, you can write your notes with Microsoft OneNote Mobile. This way, you always have your notes with you. You can also sync your notes to OneDrive and view and edit them with OneNote on your phone, on your computer, or online in a web browser.

- **1.** Tap **1.** OneNote > **1.**
- 2. Write your note.
- **3.** To format the text, tap ••• > **format**.
- 4. To add a picture, tap .
- 5. To record a sound clip, tap .

If you have a Microsoft account set up on your phone, your changes are saved and synced to your default Personal (Web) notebook on OneDrive. Otherwise, your changes are saved on your phone.

# Use your work phone

A company account on your phone helps you do your job.

If you have a work phone, your company can create a company account that keeps the info in your phone more secure, gives you access to documents or info from inside the company's network, and even provides apps or hubs that help you do your job.

If your company has apps available, you are given the option to download them, as soon as you've finished adding the company account to your phone. If an app isn't available until after you've already set up your account, your company can let you know how to get it.

A company hub lets you get to all sorts of company info in one place – such as news, expenses, apps, or access to a company store. Installing a hub works the same way as installing a company app – if one's available, you have the option to add it once you've added your company account. If your company develops a hub later, you are offered another way to get it set up when ready.

Most company accounts include a policy. A company policy allows your company to add safeguards to your phone, often to protect confidential or sensitive info.

To set up your company account, on the start screen, swipe from the top of the screen, and tap **ALL SETTINGS** > **workplace**.

# Work with email and calendar on your phone and PC

You can use different mail addresses for business and leisure. You can add several mailboxes to your phone and use the same mail account both on your phone and on your PC, be it Outlook, Office 365, or any other mail account. Your mail and calendar stay in sync, and you can join meetings directly from calendar invitations. You can use the integrated mail and calendar so that, for example, when you have a meeting coming up, you can view the attendee list and, with a tap, access any mail or text message discussions you have had with an attendee.

## Keep your data secure on your phone

Your phone has a variety of security options to make sure no one else has access to the sensitive data you have stored on your phone. For example, you can set your phone to lock automatically, or you can even locate your phone if it gets lost (not available in all regions).

You may use a virtual private network (VPN) connection to access your company resources, such as intranet or corporate mail, or you may use a VPN service for personal purposes. - View and edit PowerPoint presentations
- Create, view, and edit Microsoft Excel workbooks
- Save your Office files to OneDrive, and pick up where you left off when you're back at your computer
- Access the Office 365 service

With SharePoint Workspace Mobile, you can open, edit, and save Microsoft Office documents that are on SharePoint 2010 or SharePoint Online sites.

### Collaborate efficiently with Lync on your phone

Microsoft Lync is a next-generation communications service that connects people in new ways, anytime, from virtually anywhere.

With Lync, you can:

- Keep track of your contacts' availability
- · Send instant messages
- Make phone calls
- Start or join audio, video, or web conferences

Lync is built to fully integrate with Microsoft Office. You can download the Microsoft Lync mobile version to your phone from Store.

# **Phone management & connectivity**

Take care of your phone and its contents. Learn how to connect to accessories and networks, transfer files, create backups, lock your phone, and keep the software up to date.



# **Update your phone software**

Stay in step with the beat – update your phone software and apps wirelessly to get new and enhanced features for your phone. Updating the software may also improve your phone performance.



Make sure that the device battery has enough power, or connect the charger before starting the update.



**Warning:** If you install a software update, you cannot use the device, even to make emergency calls, until the installation is completed and the device is restarted.

Using services or downloading content, including free items, may cause the transfer of large amounts of data, which may result in data costs.

By default, your phone automatically downloads available updates whenever the data connection settings allow it. When your phone notifies you that an update is available, just follow the instructions shown on your phone. If your phone is short on memory, you may need to move your apps, photos, and other stuff to the memory card.



**Tip:** By default, your phone updates your apps and other components (such as device hub) automatically when you're connected to a Wi-Fi network. To check your update history, tap **[a]** Store > ••• > downloads, and swipe to history.

After the update, check the Lumia Help+Tips app or support pages for your new user guide.

### Switch off automatic update downloading

If you want to keep tight control of your data costs, you can switch off automatic update downloading. On the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, tap ALL SETTINGS > phone update, and clear the Automatically download updates if my data settings allow it check box.

### Use a secure VPN connection

You may need a virtual private network (VPN) connection to access your company resources, such as intranet or corporate mail, or you may use a VPN service for personal purposes.

Contact your company IT administrator for details of your VPN configuration, or visit Store to download the app for your VPN service and check the service's website for additional info.

On the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, tap **ALL SETTINGS** > **VPN**, and switch **Status** to **On** 

- 1. To add a VPN profile, tap +.
- **2.** Switch **Connect automatically** to **On**
- 3. Write the profile info as instructed by your company IT administrator or VPN service.

Your phone automatically connects to the VPN when it is required.

Tip: To change the VPN mobile data connection and roaming settings, tap options.

## Edit a VPN profile

Tap and hold the profile, tap **edit**, and change the info as required.

# **Delete a VPN profile**

Tap and hold the profile, and tap **delete**.

#### Switch to manual VPN connection

Tap and hold the profile, and tap switch to manual. Tap the profile to connect to the VPN.

#### Wi-Fi

Find out more about using the Wi-Fi connection.



#### Connect to a Wi-Fi

Connecting to a Wi-Fi network is a handy way of accessing the internet. When out and about, you can connect to Wi-Fi networks in public places, such as a library or internet café.

Your phone periodically checks for and notifies you of available connections. The notification appears briefly at the top of the screen. To manage your Wi-Fi connections, select the notification.

On the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, and tap ...

- 2. Select the connection you want to use.

Your Wi-Fi connection is active when **66** is shown on the status bar at the top of the screen.

Wi-Fi positioning improves positioning accuracy when satellite signals are not available, especially when you are indoors or between tall buildings.

#### Close the connection

**Tip:** Your phone connects back to the Wi-Fi network automatically. To change the automatic reconnection time, or to switch Wi-Fi back on manually, tap **Turn WiFi back on** and the option you want.

#### Connect with Wi-Fi Sense

Connect to public Wi-Fi hotspots easily with the WiFi Sense app.

WiFi Sense connects your phone to public Wi-Fi hotspots and accepts the terms of use for you when required. WiFi Sense can also share your contact info if you want.

- 1. On the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, and tap ( > WiFi Sense.

### **NFC**

Explore the world around you. Tap accessories to connect to them, and tap tags to call someone or open a website. Near Field Communication (NFC) makes connecting easy and fun.

#### Get started with NFC

Switch the NFC features on in your phone, and start tapping to share stuff or connect to devices.

With NFC, you can:

- Connect to compatible Bluetooth accessories that support NFC, such as a headset or a wireless speakerphone
- Send things, such as contacts or your own photos, to your friend's phone, PC, or tablet running on Windows 8 or later
- Tap tags to get more content for your phone, or to access online services

The NFC area is on the back of your phone, near the camera. Tap other phones, accessories, tags, or readers with the NFC area.



On the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, and tap **ALL SETTINGS** > **NFC**. Switch **Tap to share** to **On** 

**Tip:** Before using NFC, make sure the screen and keys are unlocked.

### Connect to a Bluetooth accessory with NFC

Hands busy? Use a headset. Or why not listen to music using wireless speakers? You only need to tap the compatible accessory with your phone.

Tap the NFC area of the accessory with the NFC area of your phone, and follow the instructions on the screen.

Accessories are sold separately. The availability of accessories varies by region.

### Disconnect the accessory

Tap the NFC area of the accessory again.

For more info, see the accessory's user guide.

### **Read NFC tags**

NFC tags can contain info, such as a web address, a phone number, or a business card. The info you want is just a tap away.

Tap a tag with the NFC area of your phone.



# Memory and storage

Learn how to manage your apps, files, and other stuff on your phone.

### Back up and restore data on your phone

Accidents can happen – so set your phone to back up your settings, such as your start screen layout, and other stuff to your Microsoft account.

You need a Microsoft account to back up your phone.

- 1. On the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, and tap **ALL SETTINGS** > **backup**.
- 2. If asked, sign in to your Microsoft account.
- **3.** Select what to back up and how. You can set your phone to automatically back up your app list, settings, and text messages. To automatically back up your future videos or best-quality photos to OneDrive, you need a Wi-Fi connection.
- **Tip:** You don't need to back up your contacts and calendar events separately. Your phone automatically backs them up and keeps them in sync with your Microsoft account.

If some of your downloaded apps are not included in the backup, you can re-download them from Store, as long as the app is available. Store remembers the apps you've bought, so you don't need to pay for them again. Data transmission costs may apply. For more info, contact your network service provider.

Your phone backups are not visible in the main view of OneDrive, but you can find them in the OneDrive settings. Check **people.live.com** for your backed up contacts and **calendar.live.com** for your calendar events.

For info on data security in OneDrive, go to **windows.microsoft.com/en-gb/onedrive/security**.

To back up other content, such as music, connect your phone to your computer, and follow the instructions on the computer screen. You have 2 options: either sync content between your phone and computer using the Windows Phone app for desktop, or drag and drop content from phone to computer in your computer's file manager, such as Windows Explorer.

# Back up the photos you've taken earlier to OneDrive

Tap **Photos**  $> \bigcirc$ , select the photos or albums you want to upload, tap  $\bigcirc$  > **OneDrive**, select where you want to upload the photos, and tap  $\bigcirc$ .

To check the photos you've backed up, log in to your OneDrive account on any device and check the folder to which you saved the photos.

## Restore backed up data

You can restore your backed up data after resetting or updating your phone software, or when setting up a new phone. Sign in to your Microsoft account, and follow the instructions shown on your phone. To reset your phone, on the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, and tap **ALL SETTINGS > about > reset your phone**. Resetting restores the factory settings, and erases all your personal content, but you can restore your backed up data after signing in to your Microsoft account.

#### Check and increase available memory on your phone

Use the Storage Sense app to check how much memory you have available.

Tap Storage Sense.

Tap **phone**. To check the details of your memory card, tap **SD card**.

**Tip:** Want to see what more you have on your phone? Download the Files app from Store, and easily manage files on your phone.

If the phone memory is getting full, first check for and remove things you no longer need:

- Text, multimedia, and email messages
- · Contact entries and details
- Apps
- Music, photos, or videos

Instead of removing, you can also move the files to the memory card.

The quality of your memory card may affect the performance of your phone greatly. To get the best out of your phone, use a fast 4–128GB card by a well-known manufacturer. For more information on memory cards, check the frequently asked questions.

Use only compatible memory cards approved for use with this device. Incompatible cards may damage the card and the device and corrupt data stored on the card.

**Tip:** If your phone doesn't recognize the file type of a file (such as a zip file), it places the file in the Other folder. You can check what these are and delete the ones you don't need using the Files app.

### Remove temporary files to free up space

Tap **phone** > **temporary files** > **delete**. To delete temporary files and other data from just your browser, tap **Internet Explorer settings** > **delete history**.

# Save or move apps to a memory card

Expand your phone's memory with a memory card and save your apps to the card by default.

The quality of your memory card may affect the performance of your phone greatly. To get the best out of your phone, use a fast 4–128GB card by a well-known manufacturer. For more info on memory cards, check the frequently asked questions.

The memory card is sold separately.

# Tap Storage Sense.

To change where your phone stores your apps and other files, tap  ${\bf phone}$  or  ${\bf SD}$   ${\bf card}$  for each file type.

# Move apps to the memory card

Tap **phone** > **apps+games** > **(a)**, select which apps to move, and tap **move**.

You can later move the apps back to your phone from the memory card.

The type of the memory card may affect how long it takes to move large files to the card.

#### Delete an app from your phone

You can remove installed apps that you no longer want to keep or use, to increase the amount of available memory.

- **1.** On the start screen, swipe left to the apps menu.
- **2.** Tap and hold the app, and tap **uninstall**. You may not be able to remove some apps.

If you remove an app, you may be able to reinstall without buying again, as long as the app is available in Store.

If an installed app depends on a removed app, the installed app may stop working. For details, see the user documentation of the installed app.



**Tip:** Want to keep the app, but running out of free memory on your phone? Move the app to the memory card instead of uninstalling it. Tap **Storage Sense** > **phone** > **apps+games** > **(a)**, select the apps you want to move, and tap **move**.

### Manage files on your phone

With the Files app, you can easily check the files on your phone, organize them into folders, or delete the ones you don't need anymore. You can manage the files both in the phone memory and on the memory card.

You can download the free Files app from **www.windowsphone.com**. Data transmission costs may apply.

# Tap 🚹 Files.

- **1.** To navigate to a folder, tap the folder you want.
- 2. To search the folder you're currently in, tap ②.
- 3. To change how the files or folders are arranged, tap (A).
- **4.** To quickly jump to a previous folder, tap the folder you want on the file path at the top of the screen.

## Create a new folder

Tap €, write a name, and tap ⊙.

# Move or copy files to another folder

Tap and hold the file you want, and select what you want to do with it.

Folders can't be copied or moved, but you can create a new folder to the new location, and move the contents of the old folder there. To move or copy several files at once, tap (a), select the files you want, and tap (a) to move or (b) to copy them.

#### Share files or folders

Tap , select what you want to share, tap , and select how you want to share.

# Copy content between your phone and computer

Copy photos, videos, and other content created by you between your phone and computer.

**Tip:** If your computer is a Mac, install the Windows Phone app from the Mac App Store.

If you want to transfer your photos to a Mac, it is recommended that you use the Lumia Photo Transfer for Mac app, which you can download from **www.microsoft.com/mobile** 

- 1. Connect your phone to a compatible computer with a compatible USB cable.
- **2.** On your computer, open a file manager, such as Windows Explorer or Finder, and browse to your phone.
- **Tip:** Your phone is shown under portable devices as Windows Phone. To see the folders of your phone, double-click the name of the phone. There are separate folders for documents, downloads, music, pictures, ringtones, and videos.
- **3.** Drag and drop items from your phone to the computer, or from your computer to the phone.

Make sure you put the files in the right folders on your phone, or you may not be able to see them.

You can't copy text messages or contacts to your computer, but you can sync them with your Microsoft account.

**Tip:** If your computer's operating system is Windows 7, Windows 8, or later, you can also use the Windows Phone app. Windows 8 and later operating systems install the app automatically when you connect your phone to your computer. With Windows 7, you can download it from **www.windowsphone.com**.

# Security

Learn how to protect your phone, and to keep your data secure.



#### Set your phone to lock automatically

You can protect your phone against unauthorized use. Define a security code, and set your phone to lock itself automatically when you're not using it.

- 1. On the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, and tap **ALL SETTINGS** > **lock screen**.
- 2. Switch Password to On \_\_\_\_\_\_\_\_, and type in a security code (at least 4 digits).
- **3.** Tap **Require a password after**, and define the length of time after which the phone locks automatically.

Keep the security code secret and in a safe place separate from your phone. If you forget the security code and cannot recover it, or if you enter the wrong code too many times, your phone will require service. Additional charges may apply, and all the personal data on your phone may be deleted. For more info, contact the nearest care point for your phone, or your phone dealer.

# **Unlock your phone**

Press the power key, drag the lock screen up, and type in your security code.

# Change your security code

On the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, and tap **ALL SETTINGS** > **lock screen** > **change password**.

### Use your phone when it's locked

You can use certain features of your phone when it is locked, without having to type in the security code.

To wake up your phone, press the power key.

#### View your notifications

Swipe down from the top of the screen.

### Open the camera

If you add a shortcut for the camera in the action center, you can quickly switch the camera on when your phone is locked. Press the power key, swipe down from the top of the screen, and tap ...

### Change how incoming calls are notified

Press a volume key, and tap V.

### Pause or resume music, or skip to another song

Use the music player controls shown at the top of the screen.

**Tip:** If you're listening to the radio, you can also use the music controls on the lock screen to change the station or mute the radio.

### **Open Cortana**

If you've switched Cortana on, to open Cortana, tap and hold the search key . .

Cortana is not available in all languages. For info on the supported languages, go to **www.windowsphone.com**.

### **Change your PIN code**

If your SIM card came with a default PIN code, you can change it to something more secure. Not all network service providers support this feature.

- **1.** Tap ( > ••• > **settings**.
- 2. Tap change SIM PIN.

The PIN code can be 4-8 digits.

# Find your lost phone

If you misplaced your phone, or are afraid it's been stolen, use find my phone to locate your phone, and lock or delete all data from it remotely.

You need to have your Microsoft account on your phone.

- **1.** On your computer, go to **www.windowsphone.com**.
- **2.** Sign in with the same Microsoft account as on your phone.
- 3. Select find my phone.

You can:

- Locate your phone on a map
- · Make your phone ring, even if silent mode is turned on

- Lock your phone, and set it to show a message, so it can be returned to you
- · Delete all data from your phone remotely

The available options may vary.



**Tip:** Set your phone to automatically save its location every few hours. If your phone runs out of battery, you can still view its last saved location. On the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, and tap **ALL SETTINGS** > **find my phone**.

#### Prevent others from resetting and reusing your phone

On the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, tap **ALL SETTINGS** > **find my phone**, switch **Reset Protection** to **On**, and type in your Microsoft account credentials.

If you selected recommended settings while setting up your phone, reset protection is on by default. It prevents a thief from resetting and reusing your phone if your phone gets stolen.

To turn the feature off, switch **Reset Protection** to **Off**, and type in your Microsoft account credentials

#### Set up a start screen with selected apps

Let your friends and family members use selected apps on your phone without access to your own start screen.

- 1. On the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, and tap **ALL SETTINGS** > **apps corner**.
- **2.** Tap **Apps**, select the apps you allow others to use, and tap  $\odot$ .

You can also choose if you want others to access your action center or settings, use the keys, or modify tiles. It may take a while for your phone to install the apps.

3. To open Apps Corner, tap 
→.

### Go to your own start screen

In Apps Corner, press and hold the power key, and swipe right.

## Manage your advertising ID

To give you more relevant advertising, your phone allows apps to access an advertising ID on your phone. You can control if you want the apps to access the ID or not.

- 1. On the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, and tap **ALL SETTINGS** > **advertising id**.
- **Tip:** You can reset the advertising ID if the advertising you get on your phone is no longer relevant for you. Tap **reset your advertising ID**.

#### Choose what info your apps can access

Some apps work better if they can access relevant info, such as your calendar, in your phone. You can decide what info your apps can access.

- 1. On the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, and tap **ALL SETTINGS** > **app permissions**.
- **2.** Tap the app you want to manage the permissions for, and switch the app permissions on or off.

After you've switched app permissions on for an app, you can make further decisions on which other apps can access the info.

### Wallet

Use Wallet to collect your payment methods in one place, and keep it secure with a PIN code.

Wallet is a virtual wallet on your phone. You can:

- Make Store payments, for example, when buying an app
- Make in-app purchases with your stored cards
- Store your Microsoft gift cards on your phone
- Store your boarding passes, deals, tickets, and more
- 1. To define a PIN code for your Wallet, tap Wallet.
- 3. Type in a PIN code for your Wallet.
- 4. Tap done.

Your phone asks for the PIN code you defined every time you access Wallet.

- Tip: To protect your Store purchases, tap the Use your Wallet PIN to protect your music, app and in-app purchases check box.
- Note: Payment and ticketing apps and services are provided by third parties. Microsoft Mobile does not provide any warranty or take any responsibility for any such apps or services including support, functionality, transactions, or loss of any monetary value. You may need to reinstall and activate the cards you have added as well as the payment or ticketing app after repair of your device.

Security code (lock code, password) (min. 4 digits)	This helps you protect your phone against unauthorized use.		
(Time Talgles)	You can set your phone to ask for the lock code that you define.

### If your phone doesn't respond

Try the following:

Press and hold the power key for about 10 seconds. The phone restarts.

If your phone freezes frequently, update your phone software, or reset your phone. Resetting restores the factory settings, and erases all your personal content, including apps you've purchased and downloaded. On the start screen, swipe down from the top of the screen, and tap **ALL SETTINGS** > **about** > **reset your phone**.

If your issue remains unsolved, contact your network service provider or Microsoft Mobile for repair options. Before sending your phone for repair, always back up your data, as all personal data in your phone may be deleted.



**Tip:** If you need to identify your phone, to view the unique IMEI number of the phone, dial **\*#06#**. You can also find the IMEI number in the phone body. For details, see the product and safety information section in the online user guide.

# Find your model number and serial number (IMEI)

If you need to contact your care point or your service provider, you may need info such as the model number and the serial number (IMEI). To see the info, tap case the info table to the info table the info table table

You can also find the info on your phone label, which is located under the back cover.

# **Product and safety info**

### **Network services and costs**

You can only use your device on the LTE 700 (17), 700 (29), 850 (5), 1700/2100 (4), 1800 (3), 1900 (2), 2100 (1), 2600 (7); WCDMA 850, 900, 1900, 2100; GSM 850, 900, 1800, 1900 MHz networks. You need a subscription with a service provider.

Using some features and downloading content require a network connection and may result in data costs. You may also need to subscribe to some features.

At the request of your network service provider, your device may collect and report Customer Proprietary Network Information, which may include information such as: technical configuration, type, destination, location, and amount of use of any telecommunications services to which you are subscribed. Important: 4G/LTE might not be supported by your network service provider or by the service provider you are using when traveling. In these cases, you may not be able to make or receive calls, send or receive messages or use mobile data connections. To make sure your device works seamlessly when full 4G/LTE service is not available, it is recommended that you change the highest connection speed from 4G to 3G. To do this, swipe left on the start screen, and tap [5] Settings > cellular+sIMI. Turn Highest connection speed to 3G.

# Make an emergency call



**Important:** Connections in all conditions cannot be guaranteed. Never rely solely on any wireless phone for essential communications like medical emergencies.

Before making the call:

- · Turn the phone on.
- If the phone screen and keys are locked, unlock them.
- Move to a place with adequate signal strength.
- 1. Tap the start key and tap ( > ( ).
- 2. Enter the official emergency number for your present location. Emergency call numbers vary by location.
- 3. Tap call.
- 4. Give the necessary information as accurately as possible. Do not end the call until given permission to do so.

You may also need to do the following:

- Put a SIM card in the phone. If you don't have a SIM, tap emergency call when you get an error message about
  a missing SIM.
- If your phone asks for a PIN code, tap emergency call.
- · Turn off the restrictions in your phone, such as call restriction, fixed dialing, or closed user group.
- When you turn your phone on for the first time, you are asked to create your Microsoft account and set up your
  phone. To make an emergency call during the account and phone setup, tap emergency call.

# Take care of your device

Handle your device, battery, charger and accessories with care. The following suggestions help you keep your device operational.

- Keep the device dry. Precipitation, humidity, and all types of liquids or moisture can contain minerals that corrode
  electronic circuits. If your device gets wet, remove the battery, and let the device dry.
- Do not use or store the device in dusty or dirty areas.
- · Do not store the device in high temperatures. High temperatures may damage the device or battery.
- Do not store the device in cold temperatures. When the device warms to its normal temperature, moisture can form inside the device and damage it.
- Do not open the device other than as instructed in the user guide.
- Unauthorized modifications may damage the device and violate regulations governing radio devices.
- Do not drop, knock, or shake the device or the battery. Rough handling can break it. If you believe the battery or charger is damaged, take it to a service center for inspection before continuing to use it.
- Only use a soft, clean, dry cloth to clean the surface of the device.
- Do not paint the device. Paint can prevent proper operation.
- · For optimal performance, switch the device off and remove the battery from time to time.
- · Keep the device away from magnets or magnetic fields.
- To keep your important data safe, store it in at least two separate places, such as your device, memory card, or computer, or write down important information.

During extended operation, the device may feel warm. In most cases, this is normal. To avoid getting too warm, the device may automatically slow down, close apps, switch off charging, and if necessary, switch itself off. If the device is not working properly, take it to the nearest authorized service facility.

#### Recycle



Always return your used electronic products, batteries, and packaging materials to dedicated collection points. This way you help prevent uncontrolled garbage disposal and promote the recycling of materials. All materials of the device can be recovered as materials and energy. # **About Digital Rights Management**

# **Battery and charger information**

Use your device only with an original BV-T4B rechargeable battery.

Charge your device with AC-20U charger. Charger plug type may vary.

Third-party chargers that comply with the IEC/EN 62684 standard, and that can connect to your device micro USB connector, may be compatible.

Microsoft Mobile may make additional battery or charger models available for this device.

The battery can be charged and discharged hundreds of times, but it will eventually wear out. When the talk and standby times are noticeably shorter than normal, replace the battery.

Only replace the battery with a battery that is compliant with the IEEE-std-1725 standard.

Only use the battery with a charging system that has been qualified with the system per CTIA Certification Requirements for Battery System Compliance to IEEE 1725.

The phone shall only be connected to CTIA certified adapters, products that bear the USB-IF logo, or products that have completed the USB-IF compliance program.

### **Battery and charger safety**

Always switch the device off and unplug the charger before removing the battery. To unplug a charger or an accessory, hold and pull the plug, not the cord.

When your charger is not in use, unplug it. If left unused, a fully charged battery will lose its charge over time.

Always keep the battery between 59°F and 77°F (15°C and 25°C) for optimal performance. Extreme temperatures reduce the capacity and lifetime of the battery. A device with a hot or cold battery may not work temporarily.

Accidental short-circuiting can happen when a metallic object touches the metal strips on the battery. This may damage the battery or the other object.

Do not dispose of batteries in a fire as they may explode. Obey local regulations. Recycle when possible. Do not dispose as household garbage.

Do not dismantle, cut, crush, bend, puncture, or otherwise damage the battery in any way. If a battery leaks, do not let liquid touch skin or eyes. If this happens, immediately flush the affected areas with water, or seek medical help. Do not modify, attempt to insert foreign objects into the battery, or immerse or expose it to water or other liquids. Batteries may explode if damaged.

Use the battery and charger for their intended purposes only.
