If there is protective tape on the camera lens, remove the tape.

Close the HDMI cover

With the back of the phone facing you, push the left end of the cover into the phone before you push the hinge end in.

Insert the SIM card

Important: This device is designed to be used with a mini-UICC SIM card, also known as a micro-SIM card only. A micro-SIM card is smaller than the standard SIM card. Use of incompatible SIM cards may damage the card or the device, and may corrupt data stored on the card.

Do not use SIM cards that have been modified to fit the micro-SIM holder. To replace a standard SIM card with a micro-SIM card, contact your service provider.

Do not attach any stickers to your SIM.

- 1 Make sure the phone is switched off.
- 2 Place your fingernail in the gap on the bottom edge of the back cover, and carefully lift and remove the cover.



3 If the battery is in the phone, lift it out.



4 Slide the SIM holder to unlock it. Use your fingernail to lift the SIM holder.



5 Make sure the contact area would face down, put the SIM into the holder, and lower the holder



Slide the SIM holder to lock it.



7 Line up the battery contacts, push the battery in, and replace the back cover.

Remove the SIM

- 1 Switch the phone off.
- 2 Remove the back cover.
- 3 If the battery is in the phone, lift it out.
- 4 Open the SIM holder, and pull the card out.

Insert a memory card

Memory cards are available separately.

Use only compatible MicroSD and MicroSDHC cards approved by Nokia for use with this device. Incompatible cards may damage the card and the device and corrupt data stored on the card.



- 1 Make sure the phone is switched off.
- 2 Place your fingernail in the gap on the bottom edge of the back cover, then carefully lift and remove the cover.



3 If the battery is in the phone, lift it out.



4 Slide the memory card holder to unlock it. Use your fingernail to lift the memory card holder.



5 Make sure the contact area would face down, put the memory card into the holder and lower the holder.

Memory cards are available separately. For Full HD (1080p) videos, a Class 6 memory card is recommended.



6 Slide the memory card holder to lock it.



7 Line up the battery contacts, push the battery in, then replace the back cover.


Remove the memory card

- 1 Switch the phone off.
- 2 Remove the back cover.
- 3 If the battery is in the phone, lift it out.
- 4 Open the memory card holder, then pull the card out.


Charge the battery

Your battery has been partially charged at the factory, but you may need to recharge it before you can switch on your phone for the first time.

1 If your phone needs recharging, do the following:



2 When the battery is full, do the following:



You can use USB charging when a wall outlet is not available. Data can be transferred while charging the device. The efficiency of USB charging power varies significantly, and it may take a long time for charging to start and the device to start functioning.

You do not need to charge the battery for a specific length of time, and you can use the phone while it is charging.

If the battery is completely discharged, it may take several minutes before the charging indicator is displayed or before any calls can be made.

Switch the phone on or off

Switch on

Press and hold the power key **(1)** until the phone vibrates.

Switch off


Press and hold the power key ①.



Lock or unlock the keys and screen

To avoid accidentally making a call when your phone is in your pocket or bag, lock the keys and screen of your phone.

Slide the lock key.



Tip: To unlock, you can also press the menu key, and drag the lock screen left or right.

Set how long before the keys and screen lock

- 1 Select > Settings and Phone > Display > Screen/keylock time-out.
- 2 Set the length of time after which the keys and screen are locked automatically.

Change the volume of a call, song, or video

Use the volume keys.

You can change the volume during a call or when an app is active.

The built-in loudspeaker lets you speak and listen from a short distance without having to hold the phone to your ear.

Switch the loudspeaker on or off during a call

Select **◄))** or []).

Nokia account

When you switch your phone on for the first time, your phone guides you through creating a Nokia account.

You can:

 Access all Nokia services with a single username and password, both on your phone and a compatible computer

- Download content from Nokia services
- Save details about your phone model and contact information. You can also add your payment card details.

Copy contacts or photos from your old phone

Want to copy important info from your previous Nokia phone and start using your new phone quickly? Use the Phone switch app to copy, for example, your contacts, calendar entries, and photos to your new phone, free of charge.

Your previous phone needs to support Bluetooth.



- 2 Select your old phone from the list, then pair the phones. Bluetooth needs to be on in both phones.
- 3 If the other phone requires a passcode, type in the passcode in both phones. The passcode is for the current connection only, and you can define it yourself. The passcode in some phones is fixed. For details, see the user guide of the other phone.
- 4 Select what you want to copy, then select OK.

If your old Nokia phone doesn't have the Phone switch app, your new phone sends it in a message using Bluetooth. To install the app, open the message in your old phone, then follow the instructions shown on the phone.

Tip: You can also use the Phone switch app to copy content from other phones later.

Antennas

Avoid touching the antenna area while the antenna is in use. Contact with antennas affects the communication quality and may reduce battery life due to higher power level during operation.



The antenna area is highlighted.

Headset

You can plug a compatible headset or compatible headphones to your phone.



Do not connect products that create an output signal, as this may damage the device. Do not connect any voltage source to the Nokia AV connector. If you connect an external device or headset, other than those approved by Nokia for use with this device, to the Nokia AV connector, pay special attention to volume levels.


About NFC

Near Field Communication (NFC) makes connecting and sharing easy and fun. Nokia phones and accessories that support NFC are connected wirelessly when you touch them together.

With NFC, you can:

- Share the content you've created between two compatible phones that support NFC.
- Connect to compatible Bluetooth accessories that support NFC, such as a headset or a wireless loudspeaker.
- Pay with your phone, if supported by your network service provider.
- Touch tags to get more content for your phone or to access online services.
- Play multi-player games against other owners of compatible phones that support NFC.

The NFC area is on the back of your phone, below the camera. Touch other phones, accessories, or readers with the NFC area.



You can use NFC when the phone screen is on. You may be able to pay or use your phone as a ticket even when your phone is locked, depending on your service provider.

For more info, watch the NFC tutorial videos on your phone.

Tip: You can download more content supported by NFC from Nokia Store.

Activate NFC

Connect to a Bluetooth accessory using NFC

Touch the NFC area of the accessory with the NFC area of your phone, and select Yes.



Disconnect the accessory

Touch the NFC area of the accessory again.

Switch the flashlight on or off

Need to find your way in the dark? Use the camera flash as a flashlight.


Slide and hold the key lock switch for 2 seconds.

You can switch the flashlight on even when the keys and the screen or the phone is locked.

Do not shine the flashlight in anyone's eyes.

Attach a wrist strap or lanyard

- 1 Remove the back cover.
- 2 Push the loop through the hole, then put it over the hook.



Use the user guide in your phone

Your phone has a built-in user guide. It's always with you, available when needed. Select 🐕 > User guide.

Search the user guide

When the user guide is open, select **> Search**, then write a letter or a word in the search field.

Open an application from the user guide

Select the application link in a topic.

To switch back to the user guide, press and hold the menu key, swipe left or right, then select the user guide.

Links to related topics may be at the end of instructions.

Tip: You also receive text messages and pop-up tips that give useful information about using your phone. To view the tips later, select \P > **Tips and Offers**.

Basic use

Use the toolbar

The toolbar at the bottom of the display helps you browse your phone easily.

Open the main menu.

Make a call.

Return to the previous view.

Search for applications.

Open the options menu.

Touch screen actions

To use your phone, tap or tap and hold the touch screen.

Important: Avoid scratching the touch screen. Never use an actual pen, pencil, or other sharp object on the touch screen.

Open an app or item

Tap the app or item.

Tap and hold to see more options

Place your finger on an item until the menu opens.



Example: To send a contact card or delete an alarm, tap and hold the contact or alarm, then select the option you want.

Drag an item


Tap and hold the item, then slide your finger across the screen.



Example: You can drag items on the home screen, or when arranging the main menu.

Swipe

Place your finger on the screen, then slide it in the direction you want.



Example: To switch to another home screen, swipe left or right.

To quickly scroll through a long list or menu, slide your finger quickly up or down the screen, then lift your finger. To stop the scrolling, tap the screen.

Zoom in or out

Place two fingers on an item, such as a map, photo, or web page, then slide your fingers apart or together.

Tip: You can also tap the item twice.



Use shortcuts

You don't have to navigate long paths to, for example, open or close an internet connection, or to silence your phone. You can access these settings directly in the status menu, no matter what application or view you're in.

Swipe down from the notification area.



In the status menu, you can do the following:


- · View notifications of missed calls or unread messages
- · Silence your phone
- · Modify the connectivity settings
- View available Wi-Fi connections, and connect to a Wi-Fi network
- · Manage Bluetooth connections

Tip: When listening to music, you can quickly access the music player from the status area.

Switch between open applications

You can see which applications and tasks are open in the background, and switch between them.

Press and hold the menu key, swipe left or right, and select the desired application.



Applications running in the background increase the demand on battery power and use memory. To close an application that you are not using, select \boxtimes .

Tip: To close all open applications, select and hold the task switcher, and from the pop-up menu, select **Close all**.

Write text

The on-screen keyboard and keypad

You can write using the on-screen keyboard or on-screen keypad.

Some options can vary depending on whether you use the keyboard or keypad, whether you hold the phone in landscape or portrait mode, or the language you want to write in.

Add a writing language

Need to write in another language? You can easily switch between several writing languages.

Select 🖁 > Settings and Phone > Language > Writing language, and select the language.

Switch between languages when writing

Select repeatedly, until the language you want is shown. The language key is only shown when more than one writing language has been selected.

Write with the on-screen keyboard Switch the keyboard on


You can use the on-screen keyboard both in landscape and portrait mode.

The on-screen keyboard in portrait mode may not be available in all writing languages.

Keys on the keyboard

The layout of the keyboard may vary, depending on the writing language, input mode, and character range you use.



- 1 Keyboard

- 3 Close key Close the keyboard.







Set your phone to blink for missed calls or messages

When the phone notification light blinks, you have missed a call or a message has arrived.

Select > Settings and Phone > Notification lights > Notification light.

Flashlight

The camera flash can be used as a flashlight. To switch the flashlight on or off, slide and hold the key lock switch for two seconds.

Do not shine the flashlight in anyone's eyes.

Search your phone and the internet

Explore your phone and the internet. You can search for mail, contacts, photos, music, or apps stored on your phone and on the internet.

Select ♣ > Search.

- 1 Start writing a search word, then select from the proposed matches.
- 2 To search on the internet, select the internet search link at the end of the search results. You need an active internet connection.

Tip: You can add a search widget to the home screen. Tap and hold an empty area of the home screen, then select **Add widget** and the search widget from the list.

Use your phone offline

In places where you do not want to make or receive calls, you may still access your music, videos, and offline games if you switch to the offline profile.

Press the power key **(0**, then select **Turn offline mode on**.

When the offline profile is switched on, your connection to the mobile network is closed. All radio frequency signals between the phone and the mobile network are prevented. If you try to send a message, it is placed in the Outbox folder, and is sent only when you switch to another profile.

You can also use your phone without a SIM. Switch the phone off, and remove the SIM. When you switch back on, the offline profile is switched on.

Important: In the offline profile you cannot make or receive any calls, or use other features that require cellular network coverage. You may be able to call the official emergency number programmed into your device. To make calls, you must first change to another profile.

When the offline profile is switched on, you can still connect to a Wi-Fi network to, for example, read your mail or browse the internet. You can also use Bluetooth.

If NFC is switched on, it is on also in the offline profile. To switch NFC off, select \$\bigoplus > \text{Settings and Connectivity} > \text{NFC}, then switch NFC to Off.}

Switch the phone off when mobile phone use is not allowed or when it may cause interference or danger. Remember to comply with any applicable safety requirements.

Prolong battery life

If it seems you're always looking for a charger, there are steps you can take to reduce the power consumption of your phone.

- · Always charge the battery fully.
- When power saving mode is on, phone settings, such as Network mode and the screen saver, are optimised.

Network use

Restore original settings

- 1 End all active calls and connections.
- 2 Select Settings and Phone > Phone management > Factory settings > Restore.
- 3 If prompted, enter the security code.

This does not affect documents or files stored on your phone.

After restoring the original settings, the phone switches off, and then on again. This may take longer than usual.

About the camera



To open the camera, press the camera key.

The back camera on your phone uses the revolutionary PureView Pro imaging technology. Nokia's PureView Pro combines an extremely high resolution sensor with high performance Carl Zeiss™ optics. These together provide unprecedented low light performance and superior photo and video quality in compact file sizes for sharing. With PureView Pro, you can also zoom and crop your photos in a completely new way. Your camera has three shooting modes and a variety of settings to suit every mood.

You can also use your phone to view or edit photos and videos, share them on the internet, or send them to compatible devices.

Tip: You can take photos even when your phone screen and keys are locked. Press the camera key for 1 second to grab your photos on the fly.

Change the shooting mode

Want to take good photos and videos without the hassle of adjusting the settings for different conditions? Or would you like to create your own personal settings profiles to meet your needs? Or perhaps something in between? You can easily change the shooting mode to your liking.

There are three shooting modes to select from:

- Automatic Let the camera decide what are the best settings.

Change the shooting mode

Take photos Take a photo



- 1 Press the camera key halfway down to lock the focus on an object (not available in landscape or sports modes). A green locked focus indicator is shown. If the focus is not locked, a red focus indicator is shown. Release the camera key, make sure the object is within the brackets, and press the camera key halfway down again to lock the focus. You can also take a photo without locking the focus.
- 2 Press the camera key fully down. Do not move the phone before the photo is saved and the camera is ready for a new photo.

The photos are saved in Gallery.

View your camera roll

Your camera roll shows the photos you've taken recently. To open the camera roll, select \Box . To view the previous photo or video, swipe right.

Close the camera

Press the end key briefly.

Photo tips

To open the camera, press the camera key.

- Use both hands to keep the camera steady.
- If you don't use the camera for about a minute, it goes to sleep. To wake the camera up, press the camera key briefly.

To get the best photos, the way you like it, take your pick – the camera offers you three different shooting modes:

- If you prefer to let the camera decide what are the best settings, use Automatic mode. All you need to do is to point and shoot.
- · Scenes mode offers you some ready-made scenes for various situations.

Example: Landscape mode: to get distant scenery in focus. Close-up mode: when taking photos of small details. Snow mode: for very white environments. Spotlight mode: at concerts where the performer is under spotlights, in front of a dark background.

 Creative mode lets you define the camera settings yourself and save the different settings profiles for easy use later on.

To change the shooting mode, select \clubsuit . If necessary, tap the right side of the screen to leave the settings.

Keep a safe distance when using the flash. Do not use the flash on people or animals at close range. Do not cover the flash while taking a photo.

Take a close-up photo

It can be tricky to get small objects, such as insects or flowers, in focus. You need to move the camera closer to the object. To take sharp and precise photos of even the tiniest details, use close-up mode.

- 1 To open the camera, press the camera key.
- 2 Make sure you are in the Scenes shooting mode. To switch the mode, select ♠ > Scenes.
- 3 Select ...

Take a photo in the dark

To take photos even in dim light, switch to night mode.

- 1 To open the camera, press the camera key.
- 2 Make sure you are in the Scenes shooting mode. To switch the mode, select > Scenes.
- 3 Select . To use the flash, select .

Take a photo of a moving object

Are you at a sports event and want to capture the action with your phone? Use sports mode to take sharper photos of moving people.

- 1 To open the camera, press the camera key.
- 2 Make sure you are in the Scenes shooting mode. To switch the mode, select > Scenes.


Record videos

Record a video

Besides taking photos with your phone, you can also capture your special moments as videos.

To open the camera, press the camera key.

- 1 To switch from photo mode to video mode, if necessary, select 🖺.
- 2 To start recording, press the camera key.
- 3 To zoom in, place a finger on the screen, and slide it up. When the frame includes the area you want to zoom in to, lift your finger. To zoom out a bit, place a finger on the screen, and slide it down. To fully zoom out, slide your finger past the bottom edge of the screen.



You can also use the volume keys to zoom – you may find it easier to change the zoom level.

4 To stop recording, press the camera key.

The videos are saved in Gallery. To quickly view the video you've recorded, select > \bigsize . To view the previous photo or video, swipe right.

Tip: You can send your video in a multimedia or mail message. To limit the video size for sending, before recording, select ♠ > Creative > Resolution, and select a small enough size, such as 360p.

Video tips

To open the camera, press the camera key.

- · For best results, close any open apps before recording.
- · Record to your phone mass memory, if possible.
- If recording videos to a memory card, for best performance, use a compatible, fast, high-quality microSD card. For 360p and 720p videos, the recommended microSD card class is 4 (32 Mbit/s (4 MB/s)) or higher. For Full HD (1080p) videos, a class 6 (80 Mbit/s (10 MB/s)) memory card is recommended.

Before first use, back up any important content on the card, then use the phone to format the card, even if the card has previously been formatted or used in a Nokia phone. Formatting deletes all content on the card.

If the memory card gets slower over time, back up any important content on the card, then use the phone to format the card.

Save location info to your photos and videos

It may take several minutes to obtain the coordinates of your location.

The availability and quality of GPS signals may be affected by your location, satellite positions, buildings, natural obstacles, weather conditions, and adjustments to GPS satellites made by the United States government. GPS signals may not be available inside buildings or underground.

Do not use GPS for precise location measurement, and never rely solely on the location info provided by GPS and cellular networks.

Send a photo or video

A picture can say more than words. Send a photo or video of that special moment or important info you need to get across in a multimedia or mail message, or using Bluetooth.

Send in a multimedia or mail message

- 1 Take a photo or record a video.
- 2 Select the camera roll ☐, tap the screen to show the toolbar, and select ≡ > Send
- 3 Select Via message or Via mail.
- 4 To add a contact as a recipient, select To. You can also write the recipient's name, phone number, or address in the To field.

It can be slow and cost more to send large photo and video files. To limit the size for sending, before taking a photo or recording a video, select > Creative > Resolution, and select a small enough size, such as 2 MP or 360p.

Send using Bluetooth

- 1 Take a photo or record a video.
- 2 Select the camera roll , tap the screen to show the toolbar, and select > Send > Via Bluetooth.
- 3 Select the phone or device to connect to, or search for more devices.
 If the other phone or device asks for a passcode, type in the passcode.

Tip: You can also send photos and videos from Gallery. Select a photo or video, tap the screen to show the toolbar, and select **=** > **Send**.

Send a photo or other content to another phone that supports NFC

You can share your own photos, videos, contacts, and My Card when you touch another compatible phone that supports NFC.

Share a photo

- 1 Select the photo in Gallery.
- 2 Touch the NFC area of the other phone with the NFC area of your phone. The photo is sent using Bluetooth.



The location of the NFC area may vary. For more info, see the user guide of the other phone.

Share a photo or video directly from the camera

Want to share the best shots with your friends? Upload your photo or video to a social networking service right after taking it.

- 1 To open the camera, press the camera key.
- 2 After taking a photo or recording a video, select ☐, tap the screen to show the toolbar, and select ☐ > Share.

Tip: If you're already signed in to a social networking service, you can share directly to that service. Select , tap the screen to show the toolbar, and select the service icon on the photo toolbar.

When you share your photo or video for the first time, you may need to sign in to the social networking service. You only have to sign in the first time you share something.

3 Add a comment if you like, and select Share.

Not all social networking services support all file formats or videos recorded in high quality.

Tip: You can also share your photos and videos with another phone that supports NFC. To share, after taking a photo or recording a video, touch the other phone with the NFC area of your phone.

Using services or downloading content may cause transfer of large amounts of data, which may result in data traffic costs.

Set where to save photos and videos

If there is a memory card in your phone, you can set where to save the photos you take and videos you record.

- 2 Select Application settings > Camera > Memory in use and an option.

Tip: You can also change the settings when using the camera. Select **\(\frac{1}{4} \)** and in Creative shooting mode, select **Preferences**.

Tip: Use a Wi-Fi connection to download larger files, such as games, apps, or videos.

Tip: To avoid typing in your payment card details over and over when buying items from Nokia Store, save your details to your Nokia account. You can add more than one payment card, and choose which one to use when buying.

The availability of payment methods depends on your country of residence and your network service provider.

For more info on an item, contact the publisher of the item.

View your downloads

While an item is downloading, you can continue to browse for other content and add items to your download queue.

- 1 Select 🔐 > Store, then sign in to your Nokia account.
- 2 Select **1**.

You can see the status of currently downloading items in the New downloads section. One item is downloaded at a time, and pending items wait in your download queue.

Previously downloaded items are shown in the Download history section.

Tip: If you need to, for example, temporarily close your Wi-Fi connection, select the downloading item, then in the details view, select **Pause**. To resume downloading, select **Resume**. Pause pending items individually.

If a download fails, you can re-download the item.

Rate and review an item

Do you want to share your opinion on an item with other Nokia Store users? Rate the item, and write your own review.

You can post one review per item that you have downloaded.

- Select the item and Review.
- 2 Rate the item and write your review, then select Submit. If you want to edit your review, select Edit review.
- 3 To publish your review, select **Submit**.

Help us keep Nokia Store clean, and report if you find inappropriate content. Select **Report abuse** and the reason. Give additional details, if needed.

Telephone

Call a phone number

- On the home screen, select then type in the phone number.
 To delete a number, select .
 To type in the + character, used for international calls, select * twice.
- 2 Press the call key.
- 3 To end the call, press the end key.

Switch the loudspeaker on during a call

To allow others in the room to join in with a call, switch the built-in loudspeaker on.

Select **◄)**.

When you make or receive a video call, the loudspeaker is automatically switched on.

Switch the loudspeaker off

Select [].

Search for a contact from the dialler

On the home screen, select , then start writing the contact's first or second name. You can also search by company name. Select each number key once for each letter. For example, to search for Nokia, select 6, 6, 5, 4, then 2.



Call the found contact

Select the contact.

Send a message to the contact

Select and hold the contact, and from the contact card, select Message.

Make a video call to the contact

Select and hold the contact, and from the contact card, select Video call.

Turn to silence your phone

If your phone rings in a situation where you do not want to be disturbed, you can turn the phone to silence the ringtone.

Switch the turn to silence feature on

Select 🔐 > Settings and Phone > Sensor settings > Silence calls > On.

When your phone rings, turn your phone face down.



Call a contact

- 2 To search for a contact, select **Q**, then write the first letters or characters of the first or second name in the search field.
- 3 Select the contact.
- 4 In the contact card, select Voice call.
- 5 If the contact has more than one phone number, select the number you want to call.

Answer a waiting call

You can answer a call when you're already in another call. Call waiting is a network service.

Press the call key. The first call is put on hold.

Switch on or off, or check the status of the service

Select [♠]☐ > Settings and Calling > Call > Call waiting > Activate, Deactivate, or Check status.

Swap between an active call and a call on hold

Select = > Swap.

Connect the call on hold to the active call

Select **=** > **Transfer**. You disconnect yourself from the calls.

End an active call

Press the end key.

End both calls

Select = > End all calls.

Make a video call

Do you have friends or family that you don't see in person very often? For a face-to-face chat, why not make a video call to them?



Video calls are a network service, and to make a video call, you need to be in a 3G network.

For info on availability and costs, contact your network service provider.

Video calls can only be made between two parties. Video calls cannot be made while another voice or video call is active.

Make a video call to a contact

- 1 Select \(\frac{1}{100} \) > Contacts and the contact.
- 2 In the contact card, select Video call.

The front camera is used by default for video calls. Starting a video call may take a while.

The video call is active when you see two videos, and hear the sound through the loudspeaker. If the call recipient does not want to send video, you only hear the voice of the caller, and may see an image or a blank screen.

3 To end the video call, press the end key.

Make a video call to a phone number

- 1 On the home screen, select **\(\)**, then type in the phone number.
- 2 Select ≡ > Video call.

Answer a video call

When a video call arrives, as is shown.

- 1 Press the call key.
- 2 To start sending live video, select Yes.
 When you answer the video call, the loudspeaker is automatically switched on.

If you do not start sending video, you only hear the voice of the caller. A grey screen replaces your own video.

Start sending live video during a video call

Select = > Enable > Sending video.

Replace the grey screen with a photo

- 1 Select 🖰 > Settings and Calling > Call > Image in video call.
- 2 Select User defined and the photo.

Decline a video call

When a video call arrives, 윦 is shown.

Press the end key.

Make a conference call

You can have a conference call with up to six people, including yourself. Conference calls are a network service.



Video conference calls are not supported.

- 1 Make a call to the first person.
- 2 To make a call to another person, select Type in the phone number, or to search for a contact, select I. The first call is put on hold.
- 3 When the new call is answered, select = > Conference.

Add another person to a conference call

Call the person, then select .

Have a private conversation with one person in the conference call

Select > Show participants. Go to the person, then select ___. The conference call is put on hold on your phone. The other people continue the conference call.

To return to the conference call, select \equiv > Conference. Or, if there are more than three people in the call, select $\not\in$.

Drop someone from a conference call you have started

Select \equiv > Show participants. Go to the person, then select $\oint_{\mathbb{R}}$.

End an active conference call

Press the end key.

Call the numbers you use the most

You can quickly call your friends and family when you assign your most-used phone numbers to the number keys of your phone.

Select 📅 > Settings and Calling > Speed dialling.

Assign a phone number to a number key

- 1 Select the number key to which you want to assign the phone number.
 - 1 (is reserved for the voice mailbox.
- 2 Select the contact from your contacts list.

Remove or change a phone number assigned to a number key

Select and hold the assigned key, and from the pop-up menu, select Remove or Change.

Make a call

On the home screen, select \(\lambda \), then select and hold the assigned number key.

Use your voice to call a contact

You can use your voice to make calls or control your phone.

Voice commands are not dependent on the speaker's voice. Commands are automatically created by your phone.

When adding contacts or editing voice commands, do not use very short or similar names for different contacts or commands.

Note: Using voice tags may be difficult in a noisy environment or during an emergency, so you should not rely solely upon voice dialling in all circumstances.

When you use voice dialling, the loudspeaker is in use. Hold the phone a short distance away when you say the voice command.

- 1 On the home screen, press and hold the call key. If a compatible headset with the headset key is attached, press and hold the headset key.
- 2 A short tone sounds, and **Speak now** is shown. Say clearly the name that is saved for the contact.
- 3 The phone plays a synthesised voice command for the recognised contact in the selected phone language, and shows the name and number. To cancel the voice dialling, select Quit.

Listen to a voice command for a contact

- 1 Select a contact and = > Voice tag details.
- 2 Select a contact detail.

If several numbers are saved for a name, you can say also the name and the number type, such as mobile or telephone.

Call the last dialled number

Trying to call someone, but they are not answering? It's easy to call them again. In the call log, you can see info about the calls you have made and received.

On the home screen, press the call key, then select the number or contact.

Record a phone conversation

You can record your phone conversations.

- 1 During a voice call, select **■** > **Go to Home screen**, then select **۞** > **Recorder**.
- 2 To start recording, select ...
- 3 To stop recording, select . The sound clip is automatically saved to the Sound files folder in the Files app.

You cannot use the recorder during a data call or when a GPRS connection is open.

View your missed calls

On the home screen, you can see when you have missed calls. The number of all missed events, including missed calls and received messages, is shown.

To view the phone number, swipe down from the notification area, then select the missed calls notification. The caller's name is shown if stored in the contacts list.

Call back the contact or number

Select the contact or number.

View the missed calls list later

On the home screen, press the call key, then open the missed calls tab $oldsymbol{\phi}$.

Call your voice mailbox

You can forward calls to your voice mailbox, where callers can leave you a message if you don't answer. Voice mailbox is a network service.

On the home screen, select , and select and hold 1.

Change the phone number of your voice mailbox

- 1 Select > Settings and Calling > Call mailbox.
- 2 Select and hold the mailbox, and select Change number.
- 3 Type in the number (ask your network service provider for it), and select **OK**.

Forward calls to your voice mailbox or another phone number

If you cannot answer your calls, you can forward incoming calls.

Select Settings and Calling > Call forwarding > Voice calls.

Forward voice calls when unanswered

Select If not answered > Activate > To voice mailbox.

Forward voice calls when you are currently in a call

Select If busy > Activate > To voice mailbox.

More than one forwarding option can be used at the same time.

Forward all voice calls to another phone number

- 1 Select All voice calls > Activate > To other number.
- 2 Type in the number. To use a number saved in your contacts list, select Find.

Call barring and call forwarding cannot be used at the same time.

Prevent making or receiving calls

Sometimes you may want to restrict the calls that can be made or received with your phone. You can, for example, restrict all outgoing international calls or incoming calls when you are abroad.

Select > Settings and Calling > Call barring.

To change the settings, you need the barring password from your network service provider.

Prevent making calls

- 1 To prevent making any calls or international calls, select Outgoing calls or International calls. To prevent making international calls, but allow calls to your home country, select International calls except to home country.
- 2 Select **Activate**. Call barring affects all calls, including data calls.

Prevent receiving calls

- 1 To prevent receiving any calls or international calls when you are abroad, select Incoming calls or Incoming calls when roaming.
- 2 Select Activate.

Call barring and call forwarding cannot be used at the same time.

Allow calls only to certain numbers

You can allow calls only to family members or other key phone numbers, and block all other phone numbers.

Select ♦ > Contacts and = > SIM numbers > Fixed dialling numbers.

Not all SIMs support the fixed dialling service. You need your PIN2 code from your service provider.

Switch fixed dialling on

Select = > Activate fixed dialling, then type in the PIN2 code.

Select the people to whom calls are allowed

- 1 Select = > New SIM contact.
- 2 Type in the PIN2 code.
- Write the contact name and phone number to which calls are allowed, then select

 .

To add a contact from the contacts list to the fixed dialling list, select **> Add** from Contacts and a contact.

To send a text message to a SIM contact while the fixed dialling service is active, you need to add the text message centre number to the fixed dialling list.

You can save and organise your friends' phone numbers, addresses, and other contact information. If you want to keep in touch with your most important contacts easily, you can set them as favourites.

Save phone numbers and mail addresses

You can save your friends' phone numbers, mail addresses, and other information to your contacts list.

Select 🚼 > Contacts.

Add a contact to the contacts list

- 1 Select 📭.
- 2 Select a contact detail, and fill in the field.
- 3 When you have added the details, select \checkmark .

Edit contact information

- 1 Select a contact and A.
- 2 Select a contact detail, and modify the information.
- 3 When you have edited all the necessary details, select ✓.

Add more details to a contact card

Select a contact, > i+, and the desired contact detail.

Save a number from a received call or message

Have you received a call or a message from a person whose phone number is not yet saved in the contacts list? You can easily save the number in a new or existing contact list entry.

Save a number from a received call

- 1 On the home screen, press the call key.
- 2 Open the Received calls tab **♣**.
- 3 Select and hold a phone number, and from the pop-up menu, select Save to Contacts.
- 4 Select whether you want to create a new contact list entry or update an existing one

Save a number from a received message

- 1 Select 🔐 > Messaging.
- 2 In the Conversations list, select and hold a message, and from the pop-up menu, select Save to Contacts.
- 3 Select whether you want to create a new contact list entry or update an existing one.

Contact your most important people quickly

You can set your most important contacts as favourites. Your favourites are at the top of the Contacts list, so you can contact them quickly.

Select \$\frac{1}{2} > Contacts.

Set a contact as a favourite

Select and hold a contact, and from the pop-up menu, select Add to favourites.

Remove a contact from favourites

Select and hold a contact, and from the pop-up menu, select Remove from favourites. The contact is not deleted from your standard contacts list.

Change or remove a photo

Select the photo and Change image or Remove image.

Set a ringtone for a contact

Want to be able to hear that a particular person is calling you? You can set a ringtone specifically for that person.

Create a contact group

If you add your family members or friends to a contact group, you can easily send a message to all of them at the same time.

- 4 On the 11 tab, select the group and ≡ > Add members.
- 5 Mark the contacts you want to add to the group, then select **Select**.

Send a message to a group of people

Would you like to send a message to all your family members quickly? If you have assigned them to a group, you can send a message to all of them at the same time.

Select ♣ > Contacts.

- 1 Open the tab.
- 2 Select and hold a group title, and from the pop-up menu, select Create message.

Send your contact information using My Card

My card is your electronic business card. With My card, you can send your contact information to others.

Send your contact information as a business card

- 1 Select and hold My card, and from the pop-up menu, select Send as contact card.
- 2 Select the sending method.

Edit your contact information in My Card

- 1 Select My card.
- 2 Select rand the detail to edit.
- 3 To add more details, select **†***.

Copy contacts from the SIM card to your phone

If you have contacts stored on your SIM card, you can copy them to your phone. You can add more details to contacts that are stored on your phone, such as alternative phone numbers, addresses, or a picture.

Select 🚼 > Contacts.

Select **> SIM** numbers > Copy all to phone.

Back up your contacts to Nokia services

If you back up your contacts to Nokia services, you can easily copy your contacts to a new phone. If your phone is stolen or damaged, you can still access your contacts list online.

Select 🔐 > Contacts.

Select = > Nokia Sync > Sync now.

If you allow automatic syncing, all the changes you make in the contacts list are automatically backed up to Nokia services.

You need a Nokia account to use Nokia services. You are asked to create an account, if you access a Nokia service using your phone.

If you use Nokia Sync to automatically sync your contacts, do not allow contact syncing with any other service as there may be conflicts. Nokia Sync for contacts is not available if you sync contacts in Mail for Exchange.

About Social



Select \$ > Social, then sign in to the social networking services that you use.

To power up your social networking experience, use the Social app. When signed in to social networking services through the Social app, you can do the following:

- See your friends' status updates from multiple services in one view
- · Post your own status update to multiple services at the same time
- Share photos you take with the camera
- · Share videos you record with your phone
- · Link your online friends' profiles to their contact info in your phone
- Add events from the service calendar to your phone calendar

Only those features that are supported by the social networking service are available.

Using social networking services requires network support. This may involve the transmission of large amounts of data and related data traffic costs. For information about data transmission charges, contact your network service provider.

The social networking services are third party services and not provided by Nokia. Check the privacy settings of the social networking service you are using as you may share information with a large group of people. The terms of use of the social

networking service apply to sharing information on that service. Familiarise yourself with the terms of use and the privacy practices of that service.

See your friends' status updates in one view

When you are signed in to social networking services through the Social app, you can see your friends' status updates from all those services in a single view. You do not have to switch between different apps to see what everyone is up to.

- 1 Select 📅 > Social.
- 2 Select a service, then sign in.
- 3 Select = > My Accounts > Add social network.
- 4 Select another service, then sign in.
- 5 Select = > All Activity.

All the feeds from the services you have added are automatically included in the view.

Post your status to social networking services

With the Social app, you can post your status update to social networking services.

- 1 Select 🔐 > Social, then sign in to the social networking services that you use.
- 2 Select = > All Activity.
- 3 Write your status update in the text field.

Link your online friends to your contacts list

You can link your online friends' profiles from social networking services to their contact info in your phone. After linking, you can view their contact info directly from the Social app, and see their latest status updates in your contacts list.

- 1 Select 🔐 > Social.
- 2 Select an online friend's profile picture and Link Profile to Contact.
- 3 From your contacts list, select the contact to which to link the profile.

See your friends' status updates on the home screen

With the Social widget, you can see your online friends' status updates directly on the home screen when you're signed in to social networking services through the Social app.

Add the Social widget to the home screen

Select and hold an empty area on the home screen, then select Add widget > Social.

Open the Social app from the home screen

On the home screen, select the Social widget. If you're signed in, the status updates view opens. If you're not signed in, the sign-in view opens.

Upload a photo or video to a service

Use the Social app to upload your photos or videos to social networking services.

- 1 Select ♣ > Social, then sign in to a social networking service.
- Select origin.
- 3 Select whether to upload a photo or video.
- 4 To mark the items to upload, select the items.
 - The maximum file size is 4 MB for photos and 10 MB for videos.
- 5 If uploading a single photo, you can add a caption and a tag with a comment to a particular section of the photo.
 - To upload a video, the feature needs to be supported by the social networking service, and you need to use a Wi-Fi connection.
- 6 Select **√**.

Take a photo and upload it

- 2 Select the option for uploading a photo from the camera.
- 3 Take a photo.
- 4 Add a caption and a tag with a comment to a particular section of the photo.

Contact a friend from a social networking service

When commenting your friend's status is not enough, you can call or send a message to the friend.

- 1 Select 🚼 > Social.
- 2 Select a friend's profile picture, then select the communication method.

This feature is available if you have linked your online friends to their contact info in your phone, or if your friends have added their own contact info to their details in the service.

The available communication methods vary. To call or send a text message to a friend, the feature needs to be supported by the service.

Add an event to your phone calendar

When responding to invitations to events in a social networking service, you can add the events to your phone calendar, so you can view upcoming events even if you are not online.

This feature is available only if supported by the service.

About Messaging



Select 🖰 > Messaging.

You can send and receive various kinds of messages:

- Text messages
- · Audio messages
- Multimedia messages that contain pictures and videos
- · Group messages

Messaging requires network support.

Send a message

- Select > Messaging and +.
- 2 To add a contact as a recipient, select To. You can also type in a phone number.
- 3 Write your message in the text box, then select $\overline{\mathbf{v}}$.

Tip: To include an attachment, such as a photo or video, select **@**.

4 Select :

Tip: To send a message to a contact from your contacts list, select and hold a contact, then select **Send message**.

Sending a message with an attachment may be more expensive than sending a normal text message. For more information, contact your service provider.

You can send text messages that are longer than the character limit for a single message. Longer messages are sent as two or more messages. Your service provider may charge accordingly.

Characters with accents, other marks, or some language options, take more space, limiting the number of characters that can be sent in a single message.

If a text message is very long, it may be converted to a multimedia message. If you want to send the message as a text message, select **Sending options** > **Message type** > **Text**.

If you send a text message to one or more recipients, and the contact information of one of the recipients is a mail address instead of a phone number, the text message is converted to a multimedia message.

If the item you insert in a multimedia message is too large for the network, the device may automatically reduce the size.

Only compatible devices can receive and show multimedia messages. Messages may look different in different devices.

Read a received message

When someone sends you a message, a notification is shown on the home screen. You can open the message directly from the home screen.

Select **Show** to open the message.

Messages are combined into conversations, containing all the messages to and from a contact in a single view. To read a conversation, select it from the list in the **Messaging** view.

Reply to the message

- 1 With the message open, select .
- 2 Write your reply, then select ▼ > ▼

Tip: To quickly reply to a message, select Tap to write.

Forward the message

- 1 With the message open, select = > Forward.
- 2 To add a contact as a recipient, select To. You can also type in a phone number.
- 3 Edit the message if needed, then select ▼ > ▼

Save an attached photo or other file

1 In the conversation, select the message containing the file.

2 Select and hold the file, then select Save and a memory. Files are saved to their respective apps, such as Gallery.

Read the message later

- 1 Select 🖰 > Messaging.
- 2 Select the conversation containing the message.
- 3 Select the message.

Send an audio message

You can record a sound clip, such as a birthday song, and send it to your friend as an audio message.

- 1 Select > Messaging.
- Select +.
- 3 To add a contact as a recipient, select To, a contact and ▼. You can also type in a phone number.
- 4 To add a sound clip as an attachment, select ∅ > and the sound clip.

 To record a new sound clip, select ∅ > then record the new clip.

Change the writing language

You can change the language in which you write your messages and mails.

- 2 Select Writing language.

Select 器 > Mail.

You can automatically transfer mail from your existing mail address to your phone, and read, respond to, and organise your mail on the go. You can add several mailboxes to your phone and access them directly from your home screen.

Sending or receiving mail on your phone may be chargeable. For information on possible costs, contact your service provider.

Mail is a network service, and may not be available in all regions.

Add a mailbox

Do you use more than one mail address? You can have several mailboxes in your phone. Mail is a network service.

Select 🚼 > Mail.

When you open the Mail app for the first time, your phone asks you to create a mailbox. If you accept, follow the instructions shown on the phone.

If you want to use your business mail with your phone, set up the mail using Exchange ActiveSync. For the setup, you need the name of your Microsoft Exchange Server and network domain. For more info, contact your Mail for Exchange administrator.

Add a mailbox later

You can also create a mailbox later. Select Mail > New mailbox, then follow the instructions shown on the phone.

Tip: If you add a mail widget to your home screen, you can easily access your mail directly from the home screen.

Delete a mailbox

Use the arrow icons.

Send a mail

Would you like to send a mail while on the go? With your phone, you can read and send mail, even when not sitting at your desk.

Select 🖀 > Mail and a mailbox.

- Select +. 1
- Type in the mail address. To add a recipient from your contacts list, select Γ . To add a Bcc field, select $\overline{\bullet} > \equiv >$ Other recipient fields > Show Bcc field.
- Write the subject and your message, then select $\overline{\bullet}$.

Tip: To add an attachment, select **@**.

Respond to a meeting request

You can open and save or accept meeting requests. When you save or accept a meeting request, it appears in your calendar.

Meeting requests are handled in the Exchange ActiveSync mailbox.

Select R > Mail and the Exchange ActiveSync mailbox.

Open the meeting request, and save it to your calendar or, if available, select \checkmark Accept, O Decline, or ? Tentative.

Check your availability

Select = > View calendar.

To edit, reply, or forward an accepted meeting request, open the request in your calendar.

The available options may vary.

Open mail from the home screen

You can have several mail widgets on your home screen, depending on your phone.

Each mail widget contains one mailbox, showing the three latest received mails. You can open the mails directly from the widget.
means that new mail has arrived.

Tip: To see more mails, scroll down.

Add a mail widget to the home screen

On the home screen, tap and hold an empty area, then select Add widget and the mail widget. If you have more than one mailbox, select which one to use.

Tip: For a more compact widget, showing only the mailbox name and a when new mail has arrived, select Add widget > Mail, new arrival.

Internet

About the web browser



Select 🏗 > Web.

Catch up on the news, and visit your favourite websites. You can use your phone web browser to view web pages on the internet.

To browse the web, you must be connected to the internet.

Browse the web

Select 🔐 > Web.

Tip: If you don't have a flat-rate data plan from your network service provider, to save data costs in your phone bill, you can use a Wi-Fi network to connect to the internet.

Go to a website

Write a web address in the address bar, then select .

Search the internet

Write your search word in the address bar, then select the search word below the address bar

Zoom in or out

Place two fingers on the screen, then slide your fingers together or apart.

Send a web link

Subscribe to a web feed

You don't have to visit your favourite websites regularly to keep up with what's new on them. You can subscribe to web feeds and get links to latest content automatically.

Web feeds on web pages are usually marked with \mathfrak{A} . They are used to share, for example, the latest news headlines or blog entries.

In the Web feeds view, select and hold the feed, then select Refresh.

Set a feed to automatically update

In the Web feeds view, select and hold the feed, then select Edit > Automatic updates.

Allow a website to use your location info

Websites may ask to access your current location info to, for example, personalise the info they show you. If you allow a website to use your location info, your location may be visible to others, depending on the website. Read the privacy policy of the website.



Change the voice guidance language for driving

Voice guidance helps you find your way to a destination, leaving you free to enjoy the journey.

Select 🔐 > Drive.

Select = > Settings > Voice guidance and a language.

Voice guidance may not be available for your language.

Switch voice guidance off

Select **> Settings** > Voice guidance > None.

Change the look of the Drive view

Would you like to see a more realistic 3D map, or are you using Drive at night, when it's dark? With the different map modes, you can see the info you need clearly at all times.

Select 🚼 > Drive.

View the map in 3D

Select = > ___. To go back to 2D mode, select the icon again.

To see the map clearly also when it is dark, you can activate night mode.

Activate night mode

Select **≡** > **☼** > Colours > Night mode.

By default, the map rotates to your driving direction.

Orient the map to north

Select 🚯. To rotate the map back to your driving direction, select 🚯 again.

Select your preferred route

Drive can choose the route that best suits your needs and preferences.

- 1 Select 🖁 > Drive.
- 2 Select **≡** > **☼** > Route settings.
- 3 Select Route selection > Faster route or Shorter route.
- 4 To combine the advantages of both the shorter and the faster routes, select Route selection > Optimised.

You can also choose to allow or avoid using, for example, motorways, toll roads, or ferries.

Get traffic and safety info

Enhance your driving experience with real-time info about traffic events, lane assistance, and speed limit warnings.

Select 器 > Drive.

Show traffic events on the map

During drive navigation, select **=** > Traffic. The events are shown as triangles and lines.

You can set your phone to notify you when you exceed the speed limit.

Get speed limit warnings

- 1 Select **≡** > **☼** > Alerts.
- 2 In the Speed limit alert status field, select On.
- 3 To set by how much you can go over the speed limit before being warned, select Speed limit < 80 km/h or Speed limit > 80 km/h.

You can set Drive to avoid traffic events, such as traffic jams or roadworks in route planning and guidance. Drive checks the route regularly during navigation, updating the guidance automatically.

Avoid traffic events

Scheduling your journey using trams, trains, and buses can be hard – why not let your phone do the planning?

- 2 Select Journey planner.
- 3 If you don't want to start your journey from where you are right now, write your start point in the From box, then select from the matches.

- 4 Write your destination in the **To** box, then select from the matches.
- 5 To see earlier or later journeys, drag the screen left or right. Hold your finger in place until the journeys are calculated.
- 6 To see a journey in detail, select the journey.

Tip: In the journey details view, to see the next or previous journey, swipe left or right.

Tip: Need help when walking to the bus stop? To see the stop in Maps, in the journey details view, select the walking section of your journey.

If the needed map data is not stored on your phone, and you have an active data connection to the internet, a map for the area is automatically downloaded.

Planning to set off later in the day? You can set what time you want your journey to start or what time you want to arrive.

Public transport routing is available for selected regions around the world.

Don't know where the nearest bus stop is? Public Transport finds nearby stops and stations, and checks the next departures for you.

If you need to get your bearings, check where you are on a map. You can also explore different cities and countries.

(a) shows where you are. When searching for your location, (b) blinks. If Maps can't find you, (c) shows your last known location.

If accurate positioning is not possible, a red halo around the location icon shows the general area you might be in. In densely populated areas, the accuracy of the estimate is better, and the red halo is not as wide.

Browse the map

Drag the map with your finger. By default, the map is oriented north. If you want the map to rotate so that it shows the direction you're facing, select \bigcirc .

See your current or last known location

Select **∢ (•**).

Zoom in or out

Select + or -.

Tip: You can also place two fingers on the map, and slide your fingers apart to zoom in or together to zoom out. Not all phones support this feature.

If you browse to an area not covered by the street maps that are stored on your phone, and you are connected to the internet, new street maps are automatically downloaded.

Prevent downloading new street maps automatically

- 2 Select Connection > Offline.

Map coverage varies by country and region.

Find a location

Maps helps you find specific locations and businesses.

Select 🖁 > Maps and Q.

- 1 Enter search words, such as a street address or place name.
- Select an item from the list of proposed matches.
 The location is displayed on the map.

Return to the list of proposed matches

Select \mathbb{Q} .

Tip: In the search view, you can also select from the list of your previous search words.

Search for different types of nearby places

Select **=** and a category, such as transport, accommodation, or shopping.

Tip: You can use the details page of a found location to easily navigate to the place, to view its contact information, or to save or share the location. Select the place, and the place is shown on the map. To view the details page, select the information area at the top of the screen.

If no search results are found, make sure the spelling of your search words is correct. Problems with your internet connection may also affect results when searching online.

If you have maps of the searched area stored on your phone, to avoid data transfer costs, you can also get search results without an active internet connection, but the search results may be limited.

Download and update maps

Save new street maps to your phone before a journey, so you can browse the maps without an internet connection when travelling.

Select ♣ > Maps and ■ > Map Loader.

To download and update maps on your phone, you need an active Wi-Fi connection.

Download new maps

- 1 Select Add new maps.
- 2 Select a continent and a country, then select **Download**.

Update maps

Select Check for updates.

Remove a map

Select and hold a country, then confirm that you want to remove the map.

Guides

Are you planning a trip or visiting a new city? Want to know what's there to see and do, or where you could spend the night or have dinner? Guides gets you connected to travel guides, booking services, and event listings for the latest detailed information

Select 器 > Guides.

Open a service or guide

Select the title.

To return to the main page, select Guides.

The service may not be available in your country.

Weather

Is it going to rain in the afternoon? How warm will it be on Saturday? Use Weather to check the current conditions or a forecast for the coming days.

Select \$\frac{1}{2} > Weather.

Browse the detailed forecast

To browse forwards or backwards in time, drag the time slider at the bottom of the view.

View a five-day forecast

Select **Ⅲ**. To go back to the detailed forecast view, select **▲**.

The service may not be available in your country.

About positioning methods

Maps shows your location on the map using GPS, A-GPS, Wi-Fi, or network (cell ID) based positioning.

A-GPS and other enhancements to GPS may require transferring small amounts of data over the cellular network.

| GPS | The global positioning system (GPS) is a navigation system that uses satellites to work out where you are. |
|---------|---|
| A-GPS | The Assisted GPS (A-GPS) network service retrieves location information using the cellular network, and assists GPS in calculating your current location. |
| | Your phone is set up to use the Nokia A-GPS service, unless your network service provider has its own A-GPS settings. To get the assistance data to your phone, you need to be able to connect to the internet. Your phone gets the data from the service only when needed. |
| Wi-Fi | Wi-Fi positioning improves positioning accuracy when GPS signals are not available, especially when you are indoors or between tall buildings. |
| Cell ID | With network (cell ID) based positioning, Maps locates you through the cellular system your phone is currently connected to. |

The availability and quality of GPS signals may be affected by your location, satellite positions, buildings, natural obstacles, weather conditions, and adjustments to GPS satellites made by the United States government. GPS signals may not be available inside buildings or underground.

Do not use GPS for precise location measurement, and never rely solely on the location info provided by GPS and cellular networks.

Depending on the available positioning methods, the accuracy of positioning may vary from a few metres to several kilometres.

Switch positioning methods off

To save on data costs, especially when abroad, you can switch off assisted GPS (A-GPS), Wi-Fi, or network (cell ID) positioning.

- 1 Select Settings.
- 2 Select Application settings > Positioning > Find my location > Positioning methods.
- 3 Switch off the positioning methods you don't want to use.

Working out your location may take much longer, the location can be more inaccurate, and the GPS receiver can lose your location more frequently.

To aid your travel planning, you can search for places, such as hotels, attractions, or petrol stations, and save them to your phone.

View a saved place

In the main view, select Q > + > Places and the place.

Group the places into a collection, for example, when planning a trip.

Add a saved place to a collection

- 1 Select Places.
- 2 Select and hold the place, then select **Organise collections**.
- 3 Select New collection or an existing collection, then select **√**.

Sync your Favourites

Plan a trip on your computer at the Nokia Maps website, sync the saved places with your phone, and access the plan on the ${\it go}$.

1 Make sure you're signed in to your Nokia account.

Update the time and date automatically

You can set your phone to update the time, date, and time zone automatically.

Change the time zone when travelling

You can set the clock to the local time when travelling abroad or view the time in different locations.

Set your current location

After you have added locations to the world clock view, select and hold a location, and select **Set as current location**.

The time in your phone is changed according to the selected location. Make sure the time is correct.

Tip: Want to remove a location quickly? In the world clock view, select and hold a location, and select **Remove**.

Check the time in different cities

To view the time in different locations, add them to your world clock view.

On the home screen, select the clock.

Select 3 and your current location, for example, London, UK.

Add a location

Select **→** and a location. You can add up to 50 locations.

About the calendar



12 Select \$8 > Calendar.

With your phone calendar, you can keep your schedules organised.

Tip: Want quick access to your calendar? Add a calendar widget to the home screen.

Browse your calendar in different views

Want to see all your calendar events for a particular day? You can browse your calendar events in different views.

- Select \$\text{R} > Calendar. 1
- Select Rand a view.

Tip: To go to the previous or next day or month, in the appropriate view, swipe left or right.

Add a calendar event

- 1 Select 🖁 > Calendar.
- Select +. The calendar event type is meeting by default. 2
- Fill in the fields. 3
- To repeat the calendar event at regular intervals, select and the time interval. Select Repeat until, then type in the end date.
- Select Save. 5

Tip: You can also add a calendar event in the day view. Select and hold the starting time, and drag the arrows to set the duration.



Use separate calendars for work and free time

You can have more than one calendar. Create one for work and another for your free time.

Ouickoffice About Ouickoffice



Select 🕏 > Ouickoffice.

Ouickoffice consists of the following:

- Ouickword for viewing Microsoft Word documents
- Ouicksheet for viewing Microsoft Excel worksheets
- Ouickpoint for viewing Microsoft PowerPoint presentations

To buy the editor version of Ouickoffice, select Updates and upgrades.

The office apps support common features of Microsoft Word, PowerPoint, and Excel (Microsoft Office 2000, XP, and 2003). Not all file formats are supported.

Read Microsoft Word, Excel, and PowerPoint documents

You can view Microsoft Office documents, such as Word documents, Excel worksheets, or PowerPoint presentations.

Connectivity

Internet connections

Define how your phone connects to the internet

Your phone automatically checks for and connects to an available known network when a network connection is needed. Selection is based on the connection settings, unless there are application-specific settings applied.

Use a mobile data connection

Select Mobile data > On.

Use a mobile data connection when abroad

Select Allow mobile data usage > Anywhere.

Using a mobile data connection to connect to the internet when abroad can raise data transfer costs substantially.

You can also set the phone to use a mobile data connection only when in your home network or home country.

Use a Wi-Fi connection only

Select Mobile data > Off.

An access point can be a mobile data connection or a Wi-Fi connection.

You can collect access points in a destination list, and rearrange the priority order within the list.

Example: If a Wi-Fi access point is ranked above a mobile data access point in a destination list, the phone will always try to first connect to the Wi-Fi access point, only connecting to the mobile data access point if the Wi-Fi network is not available.

Add a new access point to a destination list

Select Network destinations > Access point.

Change the priority of an access point in the internet destination list

- 1 Select Network destinations > Internet.
- Select and hold an access point, and from the pop-up menu, select Change priority.
- 3 Tap the position in the list to move the access point to.

Keep track of your data traffic

To avoid surprises with mobile data costs, you can set your phone to notify you or close the mobile data connection when you have transferred a certain amount of data using your mobile data connection.


- 1 Select ⇒ Settings.
- 2 Select Connectivity > Mobile data tracker > Data allowance.
- 3 Select Define in megabytes or Define in gigabytes, then type in the limit in the field.
- 4 Select When allowance reached, then select Show warning or Switch mobile data off.

The limit is phone-specific. If you use your SIM in another phone, you need to set the limits in that phone.

Your network service provider may count mobile data use differently than your phone does. For info about data costs, contact your network service provider.

Wi-Fi

About Wi-Fi connections



Tip: You can also manage your connections in the status menu. Swipe down from the top of the screen, then select **Wi-Fi**. If **Wi-Fi** is not shown, select **@**.



Tip: You can add a Wi-Fi widget **Tip:** to the home screen. To quickly switch the Wi-Fi feature on or off, select the switch in the widget. To open the Wi-Fi app, select **?** in the widget. The Wi-Fi feature needs to be switched on.

The Wi-Fi app shows a list of available networks and helps you connect to a Wi-Fi network.

- Important: Use encryption to increase the security of your Wi-Fi connection. Using encryption reduces the risk of others accessing your data.
- Note: Using Wi-Fi may be restricted in some countries. For example, in France, you are only allowed to use Wi-Fi indoors. After 1 July 2012, the restriction on outdoor usage of Wi-Fi in France is withdrawn. For more info, contact your local authorities.

Connect to a Wi-Fi network at home

To help save data costs, connect to your home Wi-Fi network when you are at home and want to browse the web on your phone.



- 1 To open the status menu, swipe down from the top of the screen. If Wi-Fi is not shown, select .
- 2 Select Wi-Fi and your home Wi-Fi network. If your home Wi-Fi is secured, type in the passcode. If your home Wi-Fi is hidden, select Other (hidden network), then write the network name (service set identifier, SSID).

Close the Wi-Fi connection

Swipe down from the top of the screen, then select .

Connect to a Wi-Fi network on the move

Connecting to a Wi-Fi network is a handy way of accessing the internet when not at home. Connect to public Wi-Fi networks in public places, such as a library or internet café.

- 1 To open the status menu, swipe down from the top of the screen. If Wi-Fi is not shown, select .
- 2 Select Wi-Fi and the connection you want to use.

Close the Wi-Fi connection

Swipe down from the top of the screen, then select .

VPN connections

Select \$\frac{1}{27} > Settings and Connectivity > VPN.

You need a virtual private network (VPN) connection to, for example, browse your company intranet or access your work mail remotely.

VPN policies define how data is encrypted and how your company authenticates your phone. To configure the VPN client, certificates, and policies, contact your company's IT department. After installing a policy, a VPN connection method is automatically added to an intranet destination.

For more info, search for mobile VPN at www.nokia.com/support.

Unportant: The existence of a certificate considerably reduces risks involved in remote connections and software installation. To benefit from increased security. certificates must be used correctly, and they must be correct, authentic, or trusted. Certificates have a restricted lifetime. If they have expired or are invalid, check that the current date and time in your device are correct.

Before modifying any certificate settings, you must trust the owner of the certificate and that the certificate does belong to the listed owner.

Close a network connection

If several apps are using an internet connection, you can use the Connection manager app to close some or all network connections.

Select > Settings and Connectivity > Connection manager.

In the active data connections view, you can see your current network connections. is a mobile data connection, and sis a Wi-Fi connection.



Select and hold the connection, then select Disconnect.

View details for a connection

Select the connection.

Details, such as the amount of transferred data and connection duration, are shown.

Tip: In most views, to see what connections are active, swipe down from the notification area.

Bluetooth About Bluetooth




Select 🔐 > Settings > Connectivity > Bluetooth.

You can connect wirelessly to other compatible devices, such as phones, computers, headsets, and car kits.

You can use the connection to send items from your phone, copy files from your compatible PC, and print files with a compatible printer.

Since devices with Bluetooth wireless technology communicate using radio waves, they do not need to be in direct line-of-sight. However, they must be within 10 metres (33 feet) of each other, although the connection may be subject to interference from obstructions such as walls or from other electronic devices.



When your phone is locked, only connections to authorised devices are possible.

Tip: You can also manage your Bluetooth connections in the status menu. To open the status menu, swipe down from the notification area, then select **Bluetooth**. If Bluetooth is not displayed, select **3**.

 $\textbf{Tip:} \ \ \text{You can add a Bluetooth widget to the home screen.} \ \ \text{To quickly switch Bluetooth} \\ \ \ \text{on or off, select the widget.}$

Operating the device in hidden mode is a safer way to avoid malicious software. Do not accept Bluetooth connection requests from sources you do not trust. You can also switch the Bluetooth function off when you are not using it.

Connect to a wireless headset

With a wireless headset you can answer a call even if your phone is not directly at hand, and you can have your hands free, for example, to continue working at your computer during a call. Wireless headsets are available separately.

- 1 To activate Bluetooth, select Bluetooth > On.
- 2 Switch the headset on.
- 3 Open the Paired devices tab 🕏 💘 🕏 .
- 4 Select the headset.
 - If the headset is not displayed in the list, to search for it, select **> New paired** device.
- 5 You may need to enter a passcode. For details, see the user guide of the headset.

Send a photo or other content using Bluetooth

You can use Bluetooth to send photos, videos, business cards, calendar entries, and other content to your friend's compatible devices and to your computer.

You can have several Bluetooth connections in use at a time. For example, if you are connected to a compatible headset, you can also send files to another compatible device at the same time

- 1 Select the item, for example, a photo.
- 2 Select = > Send > Via Bluetooth.
- 3 Select the device to connect to. If the device isn't shown, select More devices to search for it. Bluetooth devices within range are shown.
- 4 If the other device needs a passcode, type in the passcode. The passcode, which you can make up, must be typed in on both devices. The passcode in some devices is fixed. For details, see the user guide of the other device.

The passcode is used only for the current connection.

Connect to a car kit using remote SIM mode

With remote SIM mode, a compatible car kit can use the SIM card of your phone.

Before remote SIM mode can be activated, your phone and accessory must be paired. Initiate the pairing from the car kit accessory.

- 1 To activate Bluetooth, select Bluetooth > On.
- 2 To activate remote SIM mode, select Remote SIM mode > On.

3 Activate Bluetooth in the car kit accessory.

When remote SIM mode is activated, **Remote SIM mode** is displayed on the home screen. The connection to the wireless network is closed, and you cannot use SIM card services or features that require cellular network coverage.

To make or receive calls when in remote SIM mode, you need to have a compatible accessory, such as a car kit, connected to your device.

Your device will only allow emergency calls in this mode.

Deactivate remote SIM mode

Press the power key, and select Exit remote SIM mode.

Block a device

You can prevent devices from creating a Bluetooth connection to your phone.

Open the Paired devices tab $\ref{eq:condition}$, select and hold the device you want to block, and from the pop-up menu, select **Block**.

Remove a device from the blocked devices list

Open the Blocked devices tab \\$x, select and hold the device you want to remove from the list, and from the pop-up menu, select Delete.

If you reject a pairing request from another device, you are asked if you want to add the device to the list of blocked devices.

Protect your phone

When Bluetooth is activated in your phone, you can control who can find and connect to your phone.

Prevent others from detecting your phone

Select My phone's visibility > Hidden.

When your phone is hidden, others cannot detect it. However, paired devices can still connect to your phone.

Switch Bluetooth off

Select Bluetooth > Off.

Tip: To quickly switch Bluetooth off, swipe down from the top of the screen, then select \blacksquare .

Do not pair with or accept connection requests from an unknown device. This helps to protect your phone from harmful content.

USB data cable

Copy a picture or other content between your phone and computer

You can use a USB data cable to back up and copy pictures, videos, and other content between your phone and your computer.

- 1 To make sure that Media transfer is set as the USB mode, select 😁 > Settings and Connectivity > USB > Media transfer.
- 2 Use a compatible USB ψ data cable to connect your phone to your compatible computer.
 - The phone is displayed as a portable device on your computer. If Media transfer mode does not work on your computer, use Mass storage mode instead.
- 3 Use the file manager of the computer to copy the content.

Change the USB mode

For best results when copying content or synchronising your phone with your computer, activate the appropriate USB mode when using a USB data cable to connect to various devices.

- 1 Use a compatible USB cable to connect your phone to your computer.
- 2 On your phone, swipe down from the notification area.
- 3 Select **USB** and from the following:

Only Notia Suite — Connect your phone to a compatible computer that has Notia Suite installed. In this mode, you can synchronise your phone with Notia Suite and use other Notia Suite features.

This mode is activated automatically when you open the Nokia Suite application.

♠ Mass storage — Connect your phone to a compatible computer that does not have Nokia Suite installed. Your phone is recognised as a USB flash memory. You can also connect your phone to other devices, such as a home or car stereo, to which you can connect a USB drive.

While connected to a computer in this mode, you may not be able to use some of the phone applications.

The memory card and mass memory in your phone cannot be accessed by the other device.

Media transfer — Connect your phone to a compatible computer that does not have Nokia Suite installed. Music protected by digital rights management (DRM) must be transferred in this mode. Some home entertainment systems and printers can also be used in this mode.

Use phone as modem — Connect your phone to a compatible computer, and use the phone as a wireless modem. The computer connects to the internet automatically.

Connect a USB mass storage device

You can use a USB On-The-Go (OTG) adapter to connect your phone to a compatible USB memory stick or hard drive. For example, you can save your photos on a USB memory stick without needing to connect to a PC.

Connect a memory stick

- 1 Connect the micro-USB end of the USB OTG adapter (available separately) to the micro-USB connector in your phone.
- 2 Connect a memory stick to the USB OTG adapter.



The Files app opens, and the memory stick is shown as a mass memory.

Copy a file

In Files, select and hold the file you want to copy, then select the option you want and the memory and folder you want to copy to.

If you connect a hard drive that needs more power than your phone can supply, an error message is shown. You need to connect an external power source to the hard drive.

Phone management

Keep your phone software and applications up to date About phone software and app updates

Stay in step with the beat – update your phone software and apps to get new and enhanced features for your phone. Updating the software may also improve your phone performance.



It is recommended that you back up your personal data before updating your phone software.

Warning:

If you install a software update, you cannot use the device, even to make emergency calls, until the installation is completed and the device is restarted.

Using services or downloading content may cause transfer of large amounts of data. which may result in data traffic costs.

Before starting the update, connect a charger or make sure the device battery has enough power.

After the update, the instructions in the user guide may no longer be up to date. You may find the updated user guide at www.nokia.com/support.

Update phone software and apps using your phone

You can check for updates for your phone software or apps, and download and install them to your phone wirelessly (network service). You can also set your phone to automatically check for updates and notify you when important or recommended updates are available.

Select ♣ > SW update.

You may need to restart your phone to finish the update.

View update details

Select and hold an update.

Install all updates

Select .

Select which updates to install

Select > Mark updates and the updates you want to install. All updates are selected by default.

Set your phone to automatically check for updates

Select **> Settings** > Auto-check for updates.

Update phone software using your PC

You can use the Nokia Suite PC app to update your phone software. You need a compatible PC, a high-speed internet connection, and a compatible USB cable to connect your phone to the PC.

About the file manager



Select 👭 > Files.

You can browse, manage, and open files on your phone. You can also view and manage files on a compatible inserted memory card.

View the files stored in your phone

Select 🚼 > Files and the desired memory.

The files and folders at the top level of that memory location are displayed.

View the contents of a folder

Select the folder.

Organise files

You can create new folders, to help organise your files. This can make it easier to back up or upload your content. Within folders, you can copy, move, or delete files and subfolders.

Select 🚼 > Files.

In the folder where you want to create a subfolder, select = > New folder.

Copy a file to a folder

Select and hold the file, and from the pop-up menu, select the appropriate option.

Delete a file from a folder

Select and hold the file, and from the pop-up menu, select the appropriate option.

Copy, move, or delete several files at the same time

- 1 Select **≡** > Mark multiple items.
- 2 Select the files.
- 3 Select **=** and the appropriate option.

Back up files

Want to make sure that you will not lose any important files? You can create backups of the phone memory.

Select 🔐 > Files and Backup and restore.

It is recommended that you back up the phone memory regularly.
